Special Telegrams.—AUBURN, May 26.—A pair of black mules ran away with a wagon, going down the avenue, this morning, and tearing down by the ice factory, made brown straw of the wagon and badly hurt the mules. WASHINGTON, May 26.—Bayard reported from the finance committee a modification of the measure recently reported by him as substituting for the bonded apirits bill. He said the amended bill now reported contained modifications which had been prepared in connection with the treasury department, relating to bonds to be given for extending the outgoing and providing warehousing regulations as to spirits made from grapes, apples and peaches.

On Bayard's suggestion, the measure was ordered printed as a substitute for the measure in question, and would probably call up early next week.
