known, or who shall permit or allow known, or who shall permit or allow
any such games or gambling to be curried on in any house or other
place occupied by him or them, withplace occupied by him or them, with guilty of a misdemeanor and upon
conviction therefor be purnished by fine of not less than $\$ 25$ nor more than $\$ 300$ or by imprisoument in the not less than 10 days nor more than 90 days or by both such fine and im prisonment in the
