Where she can demonstrate her worthiness to stand in the vanguard of states in the matter of good government and civic righteousness.

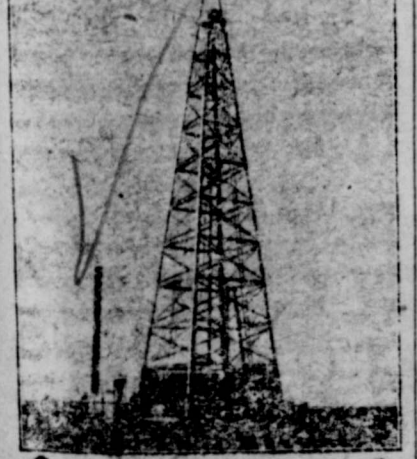

Inspector Woolsey has completed the organization of the Guadalupe Forest and Charles H. Hinderer has been appointed Acting Forest Supervisor with headquarters at Alamogordo, N. M., and henceforth all correspondence should be addressed to that office. Owing to the small amount of routine work and comparative unimportance of the Guadalupe Forest it has been decided to abandon the Carlsbad office. Most of the actual routine business can be transacted through the resident Forest Officers whose headquarters at present are as follows: (1) Ned Snattuck's Ranch, (2) Satgent Seep, (3) Well's Ranch. Temporary appointments of Forest Guards have been made but an examination to fill permanent positions at a minimum salary of \$900 per annum will be held at Alamogordo, N. M., July 25 and 24.

While the regulations and instructions for the use of the National Forests are fully explained in the "Use Book", a new edition appeared July 1 which may be had for the asking it seems advisable to explain briefly the practical working of some of the more important rules and regulations:

**Boundaries**—Boundary maps of the Forest have been mailed to all local residents and additional copies can be secured from the Alamogordo office. The lines will be surveyed and plainly posted as soon as possible.

**Claims**—Squatters who settled on National Forest land before its withdrawal, and are awaiting survey to make entry, have the right to await survey or apply under the act of June 11, 1906. This act gives the right to enter agricultural land in a Forest as soon as it has been declared open for entry by the Secretary of the Interior. A sample application under this Act is as follows: "I apply for the examination and listing under the Act of June 11, 1906, of the S. W. 1/4, sec. 14, T. 23 S., R. 18 E., Guadalupe National Forest." This application should be signed by the applicant and mailed the Forester, Washington, D. C.; if the land is unsurveyed it should be located by references to local landmarks. By applying to the local forest officers a special permit will be granted without charge to occupy and use the land for agricultural purposes before it can be listed. This avoids delay and will aid bona fide settlers.

**Special Use**—By applying to the local officers, arrangements can be made to secure permits for residences, farms, pastures, corrals, tanks, etc. Usually about five cents per acre per year will be charged for pastures, fifty cents for agricultural land, while tanks and corrals are usually granted free of charge.

**Free Use**—Bona fide settlers, farmers, etc., who may not reasonably be required to purchase, may under certain conditions be granted free cordwood, posts, house logs, etc. They should apply to the nearest forest officer. A very liberal policy will be pursued in granting free timber. Even people living long distances from the Forest may be entitled to this free use and should explain their needs to the officer. Usually an applicant is entitled to \$20.00 worth of material a year. Campers and transients may secure fire wood without a permit for their actual needs.

**Sale of Timber**—Approximately the following prices will be charged: dead cordwood \$.25 per cord; green cordwood \$.50 per cord; small posts \$.05 each; large posts \$.10 each; house logs \$.20 per thousand board-feet. Usually a purchaser has to drive some 40 to 50 miles to get to the Forest, so he should always bring with him a P. O. money order payable Fiscal Agent, Forest Service, Washington, D. C., for the purchase of whatever wood he wishes. Usually it is best to purchase at least 20 cords of wood since repeated small sales are not

always practical or convenient to make. The ranger can draw up all the papers and cutting can commence without delay.

**Grazing**—The Secretary of Agriculture has granted the free use of the Guadalupe range, by all stock which has regularly used the Forest, for the season of 1907 and no formal permits will be issued. Persons, however, who have not used this range regularly will not be allowed to drive in stock this year for the purpose of establishing a grazing equity unless they are bona fide settlers living within or near the Forest, who have only a small amount of stock.

All outside stockmen who wish to cross the Forest should first obtain permission from the Supervisor at Alamogordo by wire or letter. A formal crossing permit will be issued.

A formal call for applications for grazing during the season of 1908 will be advertised in the local papers before the season opens. Application blanks can always be secured from the Supervisor at Alamogordo.

**General**—The local officers will use every endeavor to treat the settlers with fairness and they realize that it takes some time to become acquainted with detailed rules and will therefore always be glad to explain any points that are not clear.

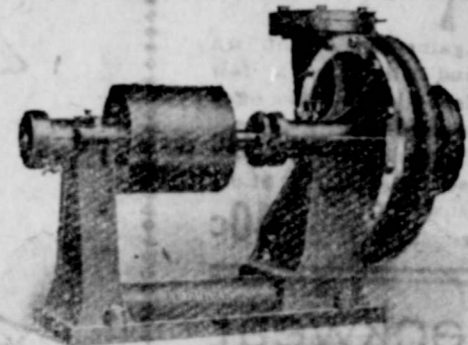
