Judge Richardson Shows That Fergusson Got School-land

BILL MERELY REAPPORTIONED.

Credit Given Where Due.

The following letter is selfexplanatory and was written in response to a request that the recent claim of Andrews to work done by H. B. Fergusson be shown up in its true

Dear Sir, In reply to your favor of Oct. 24, 1908, with reference to the claims of Mr. Andrews that he should have full credit for securing the 800,000 or 900,000 for New Mexico, was received

In reply thereto you are advised that this school indemnity land was secured by Hon. H. B. Fergusson when a member of Congress from New Mex-As other things, provides that it had been settled upon prior to survey, then lands equivalent to whatever had been taken should be given to the-Territory in lieu thereof and as Fergusson Act provided that indemnity school lands, when located, should be as contiguous to the sections taken as possible, that is, as near by. This provision necessitated the location of the lieu or indemnity land in separate and isolated The amendment sections. passed by the first section of the 60th Congress last winter was to do away with that feature of the Fergusson Act and provided that this indemnity or lieu land should be located in large bodies so as to make it easier for the Territory to handle, by leasing it and making it more attractive to parties. who desired to lease and that to the school fund, as provided

You will see, therefore, that the Act of June 21, 1898, which was the Fergusson Act provided for this idemnity land. Mr. Andrews had nothing to do with that. Mr. Andrews was not in the Territory of New Mexico at that time and by securing the amendment to in large bodies instead of separate school sections he is claiming the credit for securing this 800,000 or 900,000 acres of land for New Mexico. Mr. Fergusson deserves the entire credit. The whole matter of this amendment had






