EDOY COUNTY BUDGET HEARNG IS STARTED

| Chamber of Commerce luncheon held in the Artesia hotel yesterday. The chief item of interest was the review of the activities of the organization during the past month by Fred Brainard, manager. The major part of the report dealt with the welfare work of which Mr. Brainard is chairman. The welfare fund is exhausted and except for an emergency case the welfare committee is not in position at this time to give aid, except to donate flour which has ben sent through the Red Cross. The committee has had about 1,200 sacks of flour on hand. <br> Applicants for the flour are asked if they want to earn the flour and if so are given a sack of flour per week for four weeks in return for one day's work cutting weeds. The plan has met with very good success and much of the town near Main street looks better as result. Mr. Brainard also met with the City Council and has requested that $\$ 500.00$ be included in the city budget to be used as a local relief fund. The council has agreed to the suggestion provided the sum is okeyed by the state tax commission. The welfare board has also applied for $\$ 2,500$ as Artesia's part of the welfare funds under the recent federal relief bill. <br> A report was also made of the new tax plan proposed by a tax committee appointed by the board of directors. The new tax plan is a revision of the 1929 delinquent tax law, which will lbe presented to the special session of the state legislature, if the governor sees fit to call a special session. The proposed measure would extend the time of delinquency to eighteen months instead of six months as is now enforced and would ease up on the application of the penalty. <br> (Continued on page 4, column 6) | church was reported organized at Dayton with the Rev. Arguments against the proposed tax will likely be advanced by Judge G. U. McCrary, William Dooley and others, it was said. | county budget hearing, which started here this morning. Richard H. Westaway, deputy assessor of Carlsbad, members of the Eddy county commissioners court and representatives of the various school districts will be present and go over the tentative budgets made by the various organizations before the representatives of the State Tax Commission. The tentative county budget announced several weeks ago by the county commissioners represented a $\$ 15,000$ decrease over the corresponding budget of last year. Indications are that the approved budget may be still further cut. The county must stay within the five mill levy, C. E. Mann, commissioner said here yesterday. <br> The hearing today will be divided into two sections. The first session was held in the Artesia hotel starting at 10:00 o'clock for residents of north Eddy county and the second session will start at 3:00 o'clock this afternoon at the county court house in Carlsbad. <br> City Rate Same <br> There will be be no material change in the city tax rate, it was announced this morning at the conclusion of the hearing with the state tax commission. City expenses have been reduced, but the reduction in expenses will not more than offset the decreased valuation. <br> The 1931-32 city budget approved totaled $\$ 17,222.00$. The 193233 city budget approved totaled $\$ 13,445.00$, which represented a decrease in the general fund of \$3,779.00. <br> City taxes levied in 1931-32 totaled $\$ 5,649.00$ plus a credit of $\$ 5,649$, which equals the budget, the 1932-33 levies totaled $\$ 4,500$ with a credit of $\$ 8,775$, equals the 1932-33 budget. The total tax levies decreased $\$ 1,149$ (Continued on page 4 , column 3 ) |
