New County Bill Goes to Legislature

North Eddy County's second bid for creation of a new county was introduced in the State Legislature Monday morning by Robert S. Palmer of Deming, state senator from Luna county.

The bill was expected to be almost at once referred to the Senate committee on counties and county boundaries for action.

The bill provides for creation of Artesia County out of approximately the upper third of Eddy County, with

Artesia as the county seat. A similar measure introduced in the 1951 legislature was passed by the Senate, but defeated in the House. North Eddy County leaders of the new county steering committee are openly optimistic for the bill's chances in this legislature, but refused Monday to make any predictions as to legislative attitudes.
