

Commissioners approve funds for renovation to Callahan County Livestock Show Barn

The Callahan County Commissioners' Court, holding a regular meeting Tuesday, November 13th at the County Courthouse in Baird, voted to contribute funds to renovate the Callahan County Junior Livestock Association show barn located in Cross Plains.

Debbie Gosnell, representing the City of Cross Plains and the Cross Plains Economic Development Corporation Board of Directors, and Franke Hyles, President of the Callahan County Junior Livestock Association, met with the commissioners' court to discuss renovation of the Callahan County Junior Livestock Association show barn in Cross Plains. A budget was presented which showed the cost being shared by all the local governmental entities.

In the letter to the commissioners' court, Hyles stated "As I'm sure you all are aware, the building is without sufficient heat to make the building even tolerable, much less comfortable. It is our hope that we can raise enough funds to install sufficient heating so that participants and observers alike will be able to come and enjoy the showing of the animals. Last year's temperatures reached such a low degree that the exhibitors were so cold that it was next to impossible to show their animals in a professional manner."

Hyles added, "We have enclosed a budget of items that we feel are necessary to make the building comfortable for all involved. We have also included some cosmetic repairs and renovations that will be paid by other donations. We are only asking that you help with the renovations that will contribute to the comfort of exhibitors and spectators. Heating and restroom facility repairs are a must. We hope that you will feel that these repairs are a much needed improvement and will contribute to this endeavor."

"We have researched the repairs and costs of such and if you can commit to your portion of these repairs, we will get started right away to have them finished in time for the stock show in January 2013," Hyles

"We ask that you contribute your portion of the budget. We know budgets are tight, but we ask that you contribute as much as possible. Currently, this building is only used for the annual stock show and therefore, all communities involved, Cross Plains, Baird, Clyde and Eula all will benefit from the improvements being proposed," Hyles stated in the letter.

Visitors from Across the Country Visit the Howard House Scot and Nina Rowell of Denver, CO spent the night in town before visiting the Museum on Monday morning. Howard Foundation, he also has most of the books that are published by the Foundation. They also have the "One Who Walked Alone" book and the movie, "The Whole Wide World," which portray the relationship of Howard and Novalyn Price, the young English teacher at CPHS. Like many, the Rowells feel this is just as good story to be enjoyed by everybody, not just fans of Howard..
