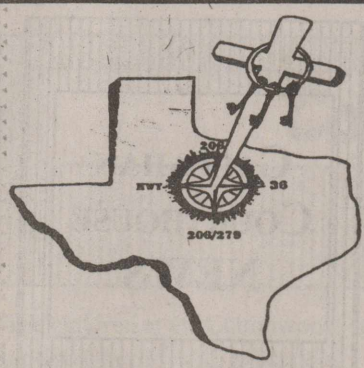

We are blessed to have these organizations to assist our community members in need.

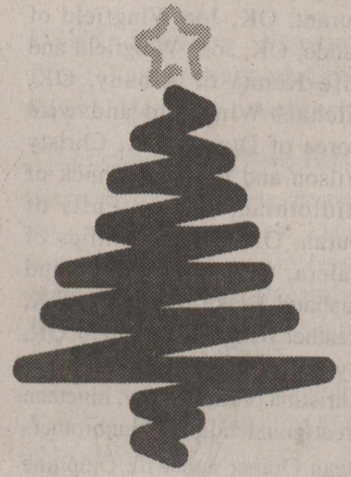
Cross Plains Genealogy Society Research Night Date Changed

Cross Plains Community Christmas Celebration—December 6th and 8th

For as long as I can remember, the small church I attended while growing up, always presented a Christmas musical, drama or cantata every year like clockwork. I can still remember some of the great John W. Peterson classics like, "Night of Miracles" or "Joy to the World". Those are fond memories for ME, but a few years ago, I started reflecting on the real value of it all (possibly an affect of turning 50!), and whether or not these concerts provided any long-lasting or eternal value to the surrounding community.

I know those special Christmas events provided an immediate blessing to both participant and attendee, but I still couldn't help but wonder what it would be like to give something back in a tangible way during the Christmas season. Local Students Participate in Unique Program

It was perfect weather as seventh and eighth grade students at Cross Plains Junior High went 8 for 8 in their rocket launches on Friday, November 9th. By a mere 1 foot, Camouflage Neon Lithium edged out Crew #1 to win the competition. All eight of the rockets successfully launched, deployed both of their parachutes, and landed with minimal-to-no damage. Such a feat is a great accomplishment for all of the students and their coach, Pat Gordzelik—better known as The Rocket Man, and science teacher, Rhonda Kelley.

Results are as follows:

- 1st Place—Camouflage Neon Lithium**—Team members Holden Senclair, Alex Stout, Alexis Mauricio, Piper Winfrey, A.G. Partin and Joey Couture predicted an altitude of 1,720 feet actual altitude 1,728 feet—variance of 8 feet.
- 2nd Place —Crew #1**—Team members Grace Goode, Kenzie Byrd, Logan Phillips, Tristan Hargrove, Nain Martinez and Brandon Waggoner predicted an altitude of 1,777 feet; actual altitude 1,768 feet—variance of 9 feet.
- 3rd Place —Shock Wave**—Team members Creed Goode, Wes Alexander, Aaron Willis, Joe Crockett, Larson Walker, Katy Jo Morgan and Harley Dodge, predicted an altitude of 1,712 feet; actual altitude 1,754 feet—various of 42 feet.

- 4th Place —Buffalo Stamped**—Team members Morgan Armer, J.C. McDonald, Jonathan Sullivan, James Willis, Dobbs McWilliams and Shana Yates predicted an altitude of 1,778 feet; actual 1,821—variance of 43 feet.
- 5th Place—Buffalo Blasters**—Team members Bryan Paxton, James Rhyne, Jordan Collier, Caleb Partin, Chloe Alford and Cory Yates predicted an altitude of 1,700 feet; actual altitude 1,758 feet—variance of 58 feet.
- 6th Place —Work Hard, Play Hard**—Team members Aston Parker, Lorelei Woodard, Cheyenne Hass, Hannah Cowan, Sean Armer, Alexander French and Joseph Revoir predicted an altitude of 1,730 feet; actual altitude 1,822 feet—variance of 92 feet.
- 7th Place—Pink Panther**—Team member Caleb Townsend, Eddy Calvagna, Kaiden Petree, Cheyenne Shields, Dakota Willis, Kayla Stoudemire and Riley Potter predicted an altitude of 1,715 feet; actual 1,820 feet—variance of 105 feet.
- 8th Place —Pink Department**—Team members James Briggs, Isaiah Guerrero, Kersey Wyatt, Alicia Sanchez and Ashley Box predicted an altitude of 1,720 feet; actual altitude 1,853 feet—various of 133 feet.

This design-build-launch rocket program was made possible by a grant awarded to the Cross Plains

Public Library from NASA's "Summer of Innovation" Mini-Grant Program. Similar high school programs have participated in the same activity, but key in the Cross Plains ISD program was the age of the students (7th and 8th grade, as compared to the usual senior 12th grade requirement), and the recovery details. Most programs use what is called a "motor ejection" for recovery. But the Cross Plains students installed an electronic altimeter that, when set to parameters and correctly installed an on board "avionics bay" built by the students, sampled the atmospheric differences during powered ascent, and deploy their parachutes electronically.

The NASA Summer of Innovative (SoI) program is designed to support student interest in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) by strengthening the capacity of organizations or schools that inspire and engage female, minority or high poverty middle school students in STEM content. The SoI focuses on organizations that provide students experiences during the summer and through extended learning efforts designed to keep students involved in NASA-themed STEM activities during the academic year.

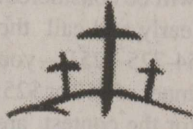

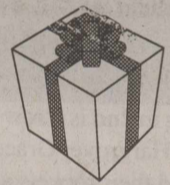

DSHS Provides Seasonal Flu Vaccinations at Cross Plains Housing Authority

Abilene area Pecan Show

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service is proud to announce that the 2012 Abilene Area Pecan Show will be held December 4, 2012. Residents of Callahan, Jones, Shackelford, Nolan, Fisher and Taylor Counties are invited to submit their pecans for competition and judging.

To enter the 2012 Abilene Area Pecan Show, submit 42 nuts of each pecan variety in a resealable, plastic bag to the Taylor County Extension Office. Entries will be accepted beginning Monday, November 26th; however, all entries are due to the Taylor County Extension Office by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, November 30th.

Don't worry if you are not sure of the pecan varieties that you have. All entries will be classified before they are judged. Pecans will be cracked and shelled on Monday, December 3rd and then judged

on Tuesday, December 4th. Our judge for this year's competition is USDA-Agricultural Research Service (ARS) pecan breeder Tommy Thompson.

All entries will then be on display at the Extension office on Tuesday, December 4th until 6:00 p.m. We will have a special Pecan Clinic and Award Ceremony at 6:00 p.m. Topic of the seminar will be focused around history of pecan varieties and pecan tree care. We will wrap up the clinic by recognizing the participants in the pecan show. All entries must be picked up from the Taylor County Extension Office following the clinic. Entries not picked up become the property of the Taylor County Extension Service.

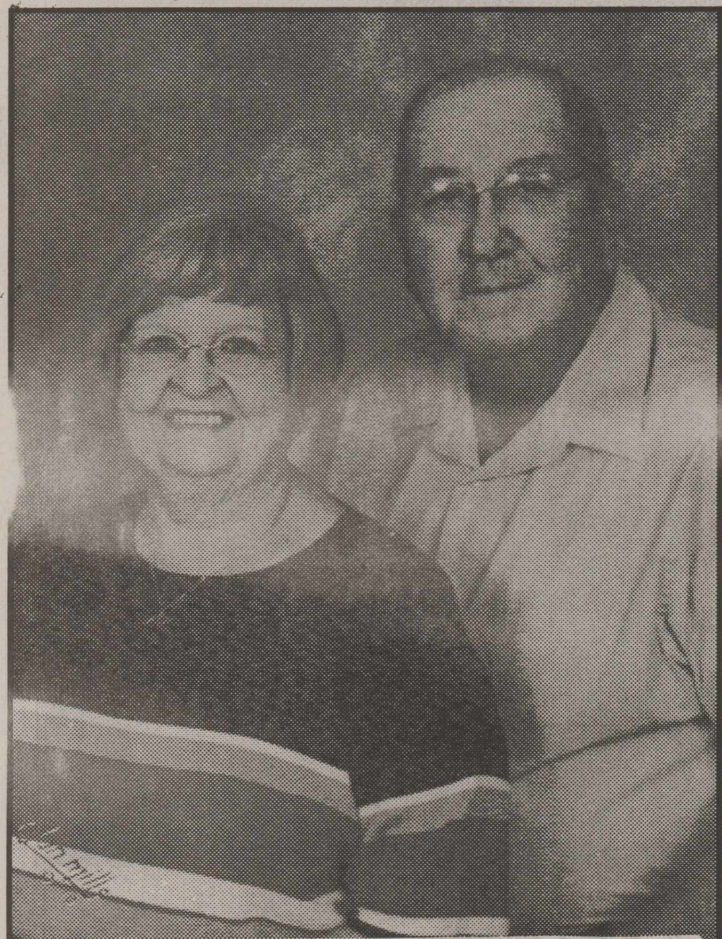

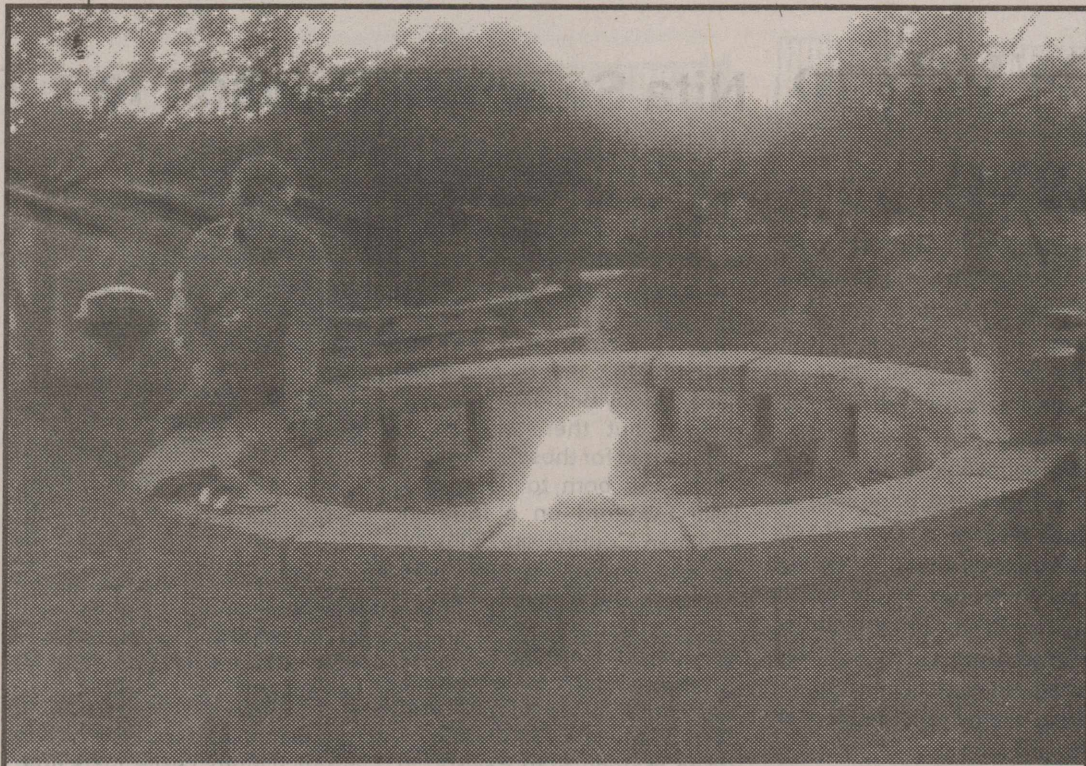

God has His hand on our lives even when we do not know it. I can see His hand on this land, and His plan to give it to me, long before I was born. That is more awesome than words can express. That is part of my secret. You see, I wanted to have a Christmas Tree Farm for at least 30 years. My husband and I lived in Dallas for many years, and we always took our children to a Christmas Tree Farm to get a tree. We both thought it would be wonderful to own a tree farm

ourselves. Did you know that the sandy soil of Cross Plains is perfect for growing Christmas Trees? The pH is perfect for growing them. Even the water has exactly what Christmas Trees need. God doesn't forget anything. That is my secret. We have a Christmas Tree farm on CR 420, that God planned for me, before I even knew I wanted one!

Bob and Lavonne Childress also sell Christmas Trees. I encourage you to visit either farm to select a beautiful, fresh Christmas Tree, and enjoy the nature God has given us. It is great opportunity to be with family.

We have a little different approach than Bob and Lavonne. At our farm, you can roast weiners in our fire pit, have a picnic at our picnic area, and just walk around and enjoy the outdoors. We also have a gift shop. We try really hard to have unique items in the store, and we also offer hot coffee and spiced cider.

So now you know my secret. I hope you will come out and enjoy it with us!

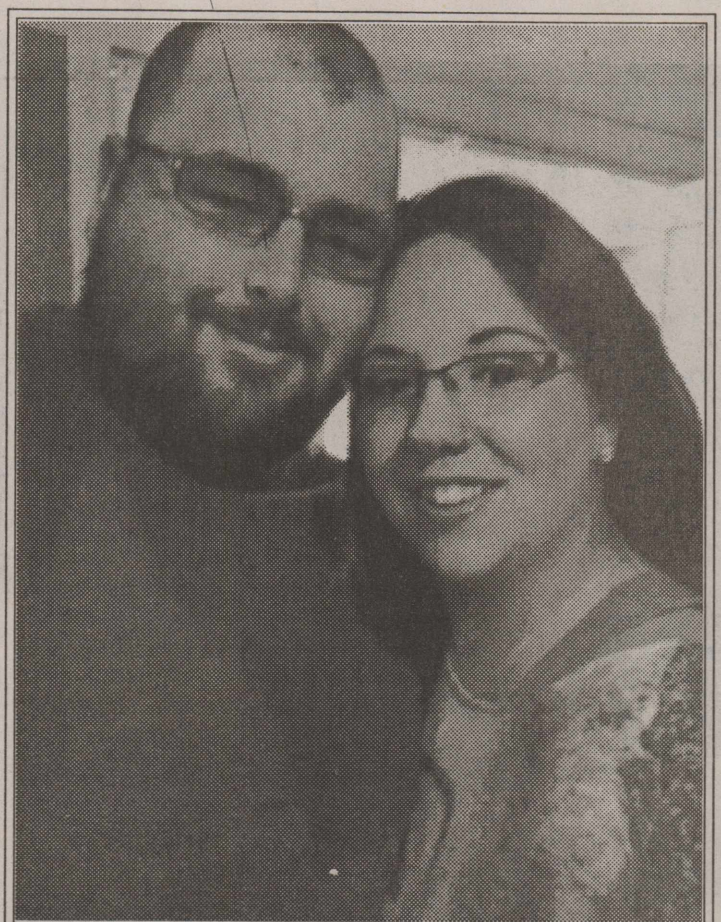

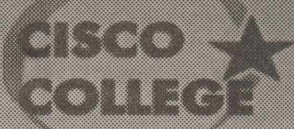
