By the time the Declaration of Revolutionary War. The nation's 1776, the thirteen colonies had 4, instead of the 2nd as Adams been at war with the British for wanted. more than a year. Relations between the colonies and the mother country had been deteriorating since the war of 1773.

The war had plunged the

debt, and so Parliament enacted a series of measures to increase tax revenues from the colonist. Parliament believed that these acts, such as the Stamp Act of 1765 and the Townsmen Act of having the colonies pay their far share of the cost to keep the colonies in the British Empire: The Declaration of
Independence is a statemen adopted by the Continental Congress on July the 4, 1776,
which announced that the thirteen American colonies, at that time was with Great Britain, regarded themselves as independent states, and no longer of the British Empire. Instead they now formed a new nation-The United States of America.
