



Ava's daughter, Shannon Tollett, passed away at her home in Abilene . Please say a prayer for both Ava and Ray.


Our Missions Group has been back home from Romania for about a week or so now. Last Sunday they shared their experiences with the congregation at the Cottonwood Baptist Church.


Last Friday, Teri and I went out to visit with Charlene and Jim Fleming at their fruit stand Countryside Market in Pioneer.





Congress; Whereas, Citation: For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while serving as a machine gunner with Combined Action platoon 1-3-2. During the early morning L. CPL. Keith was seriously wounded when his platoon was subjected to a heavy ground attack by a greatly outnumbering enemy force. Despite his painful wounds, he ran across the fire-swept terrain to check the security of vital defensive positions and then, while completely exposed to view, proceeded to deliver a hail of devastating machine gun fire against the enemy. He succeeded in disposing of 3 of the attackers and in dispersing the remaining 2. At this point, a grenade detonated near L. CPL. Keith, knocking him to the ground and inflicting further severe wounds. Fighting pain and weakness from loss of blood, he again braved the concentrated hostile fire to charge an estimated 25 enemy soldiers who were massing to attack. The vigor of his assault and his well-placed fire eliminated 4 of the enemy soldiers while the remainder fled for cover. During his valiant effort, he was mortally wounded by an enemy soldier. By his courageous and inspiring performance in the face of almost overwhelming odds, L. CPL. Keith contrib-





The Greater Earless Lizard (Cophosaurus texanus) is the only member of its genus that is found in the United States, it is primarily of Texan occurrence. While it can be commonly observed throughout the Big Country, Edwards Plateau, Trans-Pecos, and south Texas thorn-scrub eco-regions it barely occurs in the central portions of the Panhandle, roughly ranging from Amarillo southward. It also occurs westward to central Arizona, and then southward into central Mexico.

# **Cross Plains' retail sales** start 2015 higher by 8%

The City of Cross Plains' one percent city sales tax payments in 2015 are just over eight percent higher than 2014, according to the Texas State Comptroller's office.

Texas State Comptroller Glenn Hegar reported the city's sales tax payment on Wednesday, July 8th.

Cross Plains' 2015 sales tax payments for the year totalled \$138,539.89, which is 8.78 percent higher than the \$131,646.24 in sales tax rebate payments collected in 2014.
