## Texas Hero: Admiral Chester Nimitz

Chester Nimitz was a Texan
ready to serve his country in its
darkest days. Through clever darkest days. Through clever nation, Nimitz led naval forces
in the Pacific to victory in World War II.
Chester William Nimitz was born in Fredericksburg in 1885. His father died just before he was
born, and he was raised by his mother and paternal grandfa-
ther, Charles Nimitz. The elder ther, Charles Nimitz. The elder
Nimitz was a German immigrant Nimitz was a German immigrant
and had been a sailor before he and had been a sailor before he
settled in Texas in the 1850s. He also had served as a captain
in the Confederate Army during in the Confederate Army during
the Civil War. He had a profound the Civil War. He had a profound
impact on the younger Nimitz. impact on the younger Nimitz.
As he reached adulthood, he
wanted to serve his country and applied for admission to the U. S. Military Academy at West Point. His congressman
convinced him to apply to the convinced him to apply to the
U. S. Naval Academy, where he graduated seventh in his class in 1905. He served with

1926, he established the navy's first ROTC program to ensure a steady supply of reliable, educated officers for the navy. He respected for his dedication and his imagination in modernizing engine designs, submarine contruction, and sueving techniqus. On December 17, 1941, ten days after the disastrous attack on the Pacific fleet at Pearl Harbor, President Franklin D. mander-in-chief of the Pacific fleet.
