## SOUND ADVICE

Jno. Burson struck a keynote Monday night at the railroad meeting when he warned the property owners of Silverton against holding their property too high.

If the proposed railroad becomes a reality, Silverton is bound to boom for awhile-but, there is a limit to what real estate is worth in a small town.

If you have property and find a buyer for it at a good price, take Mr. Burson's advice and SELL. You don't have to sell it all, but sell a part of it at a live and let live price, if the buyer will agree to put up a building on the property immediately.

You would then make your profit on the increased value of adjacent holdings. Mr. Burson said that his property was on the market at a reasonable figure and the only conditions were that building restrictions be stipulated in the deed, on business property requiring brick buildings to be erected.
