



generation needs. ISAIAH'S TIMES

Isaiah lived in the closing days of Uzziah's life. The reign of this great king was marked by expansion, prosperity, luxury and peace. His kingdom, with Jerusaleum as the capital, and the Northern Kingdom, with Samaria as capital, were blessed during the forty years preceding Isaiah's ministry with unparalled prosperity. Luxury and vice went hand and hand and conditions were exceedingly bad when the good king Uzziah died. They could not withstand the temptations which peace and luxury thrust before them. Certain doom faced them.

AMOS AND HOSEA. Amos and Hosea came to the northern kingdom with God's word of enevitable punishment. They literally preached their hearts out, but to no avail. The people did not want to hear them and would not heed their earnest words. The end came for Israel in 722 B. C. and the




