



## Historic Prew House in Clyde Receives Historical Marker

CLYDE — The historic Prew House in Clyde, has been named a Recorded Texas Historic Landmark, significant to the history of this community and state, and worthy of preservation, announced Charles Woodburn of Amarillo, president of the Texas State Historical Survey Committee.

As a result of meeting TSHSC requirements for this high official designation, the Texas Historical Building Medallion with interpretive plate giving a capsule history of the structure will be affixed to the structure.

Dedication of the marker will be announced by B. C. Christman of Baird, chairman of the Callahan County Historical Survey Committee.

A certificate signed by Gov. Preston Smith, Charles Woodburn and Mr. Christman will be presented at the dedication.

The inscription on the marker reads:

**THE PREW HOUSE**  
Typically Victorian in style. Built in 1906 by Frank X. Prew, who emigrated from Wisconsin in 1889, desiring to live in a young country. He began a small farm and worked on railroad.

Structure is mainly pine, the oak wainscoting downstairs has decorated beading, as does woodwork on windows and

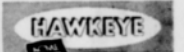

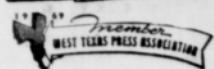
