Muleshoe Area Medical Center hires new surgeon

People from Muleshoe in need of general or microscopic surgery will no longer have to drive to Lubbock. Muleshoe Area Medical Center (MAMC) has hired a new surgeon on a contract basis.

According to Richard Murphy, administrator for MAMC, Dr. Robert G. Johnson will be moving to Muleshoe as soon as he is able

to complete his licensure process in order to get a narcotics permit in the state of Texas.

Johnson has signed a fouryear contract with the hospital. He will replace Dr. Austin Dixon, who left Muleshoe hospital last November.

MAMC has been without a surgeon since November.

"We have been having to ship all of the people needing

surgery to Lubbock," Murphy on surgical oncology at Mesaid. When Johnson makes his move, he will be able to perform all types of general and microscopic surgery in Mule-

Johnson is coming to Muleshoe from West Covina, Calif.

Johnson did a fellowship in vascular surgery at New York Medical College in New York from 1974-75 and a fellowship



Muleshoe woman reportedly missing

A 32-year-old Muleshoe woman who has not been seen or heard from in almost three weeks has been reported missing.

According to police reports at the Muleshoe Police Department, Terry Marie Brewster was last seen in Muleshoe at her residence on May 18, after reportedly having a disagreement with someone.

Muleshoe Police Chief Julian Dominguez said that Brewster had reportedly disappeared for a few days once before after having a disagreement with someone. However, there is concern at this point because no one has heard anything about her in weeks.

Dominguez said, "When someone (an adult) is reported missing this long, whether voluntarily, we have to treat it as a missing person report at some point, until we find out that she is okay, We are mainly concerned about her welfare."

"We don't suspect foul play at this point," he said.

Brewster was believed to possibly be in a Ford LTD car, four wheel drive. The car is described as being white over gold in color. However, Dominguez said that the po-

lice department has learned that this car was located in Lubbock and was reportedly sold the day after Brewster was reported missing.

Brewster is described as being 5'4" in height and weighs 190 pounds. She has brown hair and blue eyes.

Brewster has two children and is married to Marion Brewster. They co-own a restaurant. Brewster reportedly had overnight bags with her when she left.

Dominguez said that Brewster reportedly was seen at a Lubbock bus station on May 18. He said the latest sighting the police department received on her was a report

Hospital to hold grand opening for Heli-pad

Muleshoe Area Medical Center will celebrate the completion of a new Helipad with a grand opening.

The grand opening has been set for Thursday, June 9 at 10 a.m. at the Heli-pad site, located behind the hospital.

The Aerocare Helicopter, will fly in from Lubbock on that day, according to hospital administrator Richard Murphy.

The Heli-pad was built on the site where the Aerocare Helicopter lands when it comes to and from Muleshoe.

The pad was completed on May 15. Prior to its construction, the Aerocare Helicopter would land on the parking lot in that area.

"The pad provides a specific place for the helicopter to land now in a lighted, unobstructed area," Murphy said.

Murphy said that Aero-Care paid for the Helipad which costed an estimated \$6,000. The public is welcome to attend the grand opening on Thursday.

The Aerocare Helicopter is used to transport patients who need additional medical attention to Lubbock.

The Aerocare helicopter is owned by Methodist Hospital in Lubbock.

Preliminary results of TAAS encouraging

Based on preliminary results of the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS) tests administered to Muleshoe school students this past spring, the scores are encouraging.

"We are seeing some significant increases," said Bill Moore, superintendent for the Muleshoe Independent School District (MISD), during a board meeting on Monday.

The State of Texas requires all school children in grades 3-8 to take the TAAS tests. Students in grades 10-12 are also required to take the exit level TAAS tests. Students must meet minimum expectations on the TAAS test in order to be able to graduate from high school.

Adrian Meador, assistant superintendent of instruction for MISD said, "97 percent of our seniors at Muleshoe High passed the TAAS test this year."

In order to pass the TAAS test, a student must meet the minimum expectations, Meador said. Students are tested in a variety of academic areas, including math, science, reading and writing.

Meador reported that scores in writing are up.

Meador said MISD will not have detailed information to compare the scores on a statelevel until next week. However, he was able to note some significant increases in comparing the scores to MISD students last year.

Meador said that last year, 4th grade students who took the TAAS test and met minimum expectations was 33 percent. Students who took the TAAS test this year as 4th graders had a 38 percent minimum expectations rate.

Now 5th grade students this year who had a 33 percent success rate when they took the TAAS test as 4th graders, had a significant increase, finishing with a 50 percent success rate.

The most noteable change was among Watson Junior High students. Current 7th graders who took the TAAS

He added, "Even if a bi-

cycle is registered though, it is still up to people to lock up their bicycles. Don't make it easy for thieves," he said.

Dominguez said anyone who is not able to make it on this day though can still have their bicycles registered by contacting Officer Benny



test two years ago, had a 36 percent success rate. This year, the junior high had a 61 percent success rate.

"This is a tremendous gain to us and our teachers," Moore said. "If we can keep this pace up, we will be in good shape."

This 61 percent success rate almost brings the junior high up to meeting an honorary level by the state.

Moore said that the state recognizes school districts that have at least a 65 percent success rate. To meet this status though, a school district must also have good average daily attendance and meet other criteria.

The exemplary level is the highest level of honor the state has for school districts. A school district must have a successful TAAS rate of at least 90 percent. Under this level, some school districts may qualify for additional funding.

Also during the meeting on Monday, the board approved continuing an interlocal

agreement with neighboring Chapter 36 school districts, Sudan and Whiteface, for the sale of weighted average daily attendance units (WADAs).

WADAs are the units the state uses to count students. Students enrolled in special programs may count for more than one unit.

Moore said that following Legislative action two years ago, Texas school districts deal with funding by using WADAs. Districts are allowed to have only so much funding. Under the system, wealthy school districts with above average WADAs have to sell them to poorer school districts. Moore said the Sudan school district will sell WADAs to MISD, which will increase MISD's income level.

In other business Monday, the board of trustees voted to hire Laurel Attardi as a teacher at DeShazo Elementary School, following an executive session.

Legal Matters

Legal protection for seniors

The Office of the Attorney General is charged with defending the laws and the Constitution of the State of Texas. But in human terms, the legal actions we take are often critical to the health and well-being of our most vulnerable citizens.

This is particularly true for the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit and the Elder Law Section of our Consumer Protection Division.

These sections identify and aggressively prosecute those who cheat, deceive and abuse our senior citizens. When our attorneys file suit, their actions may mean the end or prevention of abuse in a nursing home. Or it may mean financial restitution to senior citizens who have been cheated out of their life savings.

Ensuring Quality Treatment in Nursing Homes

One of the most important roles our office plays in protecting seniors involves longterm care. The legal actions are taken on behalf of the Texas Department of Human Services, and may involve court orders, appointments of trustees, injunctions, civil penalties or criminal prosecutions.

dard nursing homes, the reality is that owners and employees of these facilities can be made to clean up their operations immediately. In extreme cases, homes that violate

health and safety codes may be closed down, and residents removed to more suitable quar-

The unit also investigates patient abuse and criminal neglect in health care facilities which receive medicaid. If an investigation turns up any wrong doing, the case will be referred to the appropriate district or county attorney, or the U.S. attorney's office for pros-

Last year, following the deaths of an elderly patient and an invalid, we won the first grand jury indictment of a nursing home corporation. While the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit pursued these criminal charges, the Elder Law Section filed suit, and succeeded in placing the nursing home under a trustee. An Ounce of Prevention

Another major part of the Elder Law Section's work involves the investigation and prosecution of fraud. Many of these scams involve financial, home improvement, and insurance services, and their advertising and sales techniques often deliberately target the seniors.

Although we prosecute these cases aggressively, we are not content to wait around and file suit after the damage is done. By then, the thieves may have disappeared. And even if we find them, they may have squandered the money they have stolen.

We do our job best when we inform people about fraud and scams before they can be cheated. Therefore, we place a very high value on programs that educate people-especially those most vulnerable-so they can recognize and avoid falling for solicitations that involve possible fraud.

In rooting our medicaid fraud and patient abuse, the public also can play a large role. We encourage Texans to get involved in activities at a local nursing home.




