> The Baker-Schmidt type was designed by James G. Baker, research associate of the Harvard observatory and consultant to the Perkins-Elmer corporation here, which built the first model of this

> The Schmidt telescope, actually a giant camera, has one mirror and a correcting lens. The Baker-Schmidt telescope-camera has two mirrors in addition to the correcting lens. The addition of the secuse a flat photographic plate, instead of the curved plate of the conventional Schmidt telescope.

> This flat field, or flat focal surface, it was explained, makes it possible to photograph stars with one-hundred-thousandth of the light of the faintest star seen by the naked eye in no more than twenty minutes, much faster than ever before. The flat field also makes it possible to photograph a much larger area of the sky than ever







### Pres, Gons of Pastourizing Presented to Dairy Farmers

Dairy farmers were warned recently that pasteurization is not a substitute for healthy cows and sanitary methods of milk production-and that failure to recognize this will prove harmful to the en-

tire dairy industry. Pointing out that "vigorous organized opposition to pasteurization continues to flare up," the Journal of the American Veterinary Medical association aired both sides of the pasteurized milk controversy. and cited these facts:

Pasteurization has so increased the popularity of milk and milk products that 27 million cows are now scarcely enough to supply the demand, in contrast to former times when farmers had many less cows yet more milk than they could

The heating process used in pas teurization, whereby disease germs are destroyed, takes little if anything from the nutritive value or flavor of the milk.

Starling Under Suspicion The starling, one of the nation's worst nuisance birds, is now under suspicion as a disease carrier. The American Veterinary Medical association reports that veterinarians have isolated the virus of Newcastle disease, a serious poultry malady, from a young starling found near Ithaca, N.Y. Newcastle disease is a respiratory-nervous disorder that kills many chickens and other poultry and causes heavy losses in egg production. Investigating veterinarians think the starling contracted the disease from its parents, who may have come into contact with, an infected poultry flock while ranging for food.

Venezuela Encourages Immigrants With a scant four and a half million people to occupy a country bigger than Texas and Loiusiana, Venezuela needs an enlarged and wellbalanced population to exploit the land's riches and tame an undeveloped wilderness. That explains why the Venezuelan government recently threw open the immigration doors to 2,000 Europeans monthly. And, in effect, laid down the red carpet, too. Not only are immigrants urged to come to Venezuela but the government is offering them grants of rich, well-watered farm land, plus long-term, low-interest loans for machinery and equipment





### **Gains Against Tuberculosis** Accelerated by Chest X-Ray

The tuberculosis death rate in the United States for 1949 set an all-time low record showing a reduction of about 10 per cent from the figure of the year before. The present rate in the population is mly about one-half that of 12 years

The gains against tuberculosis have been accelerated during the postwar years, and should the recent trend continue, the disease before long will be relegated to a ninor position among the causes of liness and death in our country.

At present, only one state (Arizona has a tuberculosis death rate of over 60 per 100,000 population. In 1933, when nationwide figures first became available, 19 states and the District of Columbia had rates of 60 or higher.

Intensified public interest and upport, of which the Christmas seal campaign is part, is seen as an outstanding factor in accelerating the decline of the tuberculosis death rate. Since the end of the war, case finding has been pushed ar are receiving Xtray examina-

At the same time, efforts have een initiated to increase the facilities for the care and treatment of tuberculosis, Recent research on streptomycin and other new drugs comises that chemotherapy may play a larger role in the future.

There are now 600 foresters and 12,000 timber fellers employed by e forest industries in the Douglas fir region, (Western Washington and Oregon). Since the war the use of powered chain saws for the felling of big trees in the Douglas fir region has become general. Among these trees many huge ir stumps that were made 50 or 60 ears ago still stand. Usually they re "two springboards" high, someimes three. Even in the second growth of the 1920's and recent ears the stumps left over from cuting with ax and muscle-powered laws still represent much loss of

Preliminary results on first exensive studies undertaken to determine heat generated in the mouth during dental drilling has been reported by a University of

A maximum rise of 140 degrees during laboratory tests was report-The age-old plaint of housewives, ed by Dr. Floyd A. Peyton, professor of dentistry.

However, he pointed out that the average temperature rise when drilling tooth enamel is about 100 degrees, and about a 38-degree rise occurs when drilling the dentin un-

Dr. Peyton said that preliminary studies with steel, diamond point and carborundum cutting tools suggest that less temperature rise occurs when drilling is done at low speeds, with small cutting tool sizes and with light pressure applications. He also indicated that contin-The last refuge for the American uous force on the cutting instrument causes greater heat than an intermittent method of drilling for two or three seconds and stopping for a second.

Experiments with the new gas propelled airbrasive technique now under development show there is no significant temperature changes during drilling, Dr. Peyton declar-

He said that future experiments are planned to study the effect of temperature changes on mouth tis-

The above results described by Dr. Peyton were all obtained from measurements made on extracted adult molar and bicuspid teeth. The temperature changes were recorded by inserting a fine wire into a small specially drilled hole through the enamel on the side of the tooth. This wire, called a "thermocouple," was attached to an automatic recording instrument.

#### French Port of Dunkerque Regaining Its World Trade

Dunkerque, scene of the epic British evacuation of World War II, is rapidly regaining its prewar position in France's economy.

The city's main activity, shipping, now almost equals its 1938 tempo. With most of its docks and warehouses rebuilt, the warwrecked harbor ranks fourth-its former place-among French ports in world commerce. Only Marseille, Le Havre and Rouen handle

### Sky Blue News

When you are planning to paint the walls of a room, take into consideration the various qualities of a color. Blue, for instance, is the color associated with sky and water. It is clear, cool and transparent in quality. Because it is difficult to focus sharply, it is soft and atmospheric. Under the influence of blue light, there is decreased muscular tension. Because of this, blue is likely to lower the blood pressure and reduce pulse and respiration rate. Emotionally, the color inspires peace and introspec-tion. By test it is found to be the most subduing of colors.

Care of Horses' Teeth Horse owners occasionally notice that their horses do not do well and even salivate and expel food from their mouths. This trouble is usually due to diseased teeth that should be removed. Symptoms of diseased teeth in horses are failure to keep in proper flesh even though well led. (quidding) or spitting out of balls of feed during cating, passing of whole grain, drooling of saliva, slow, careful mastication with the head often tilted to one side, disagreeable odor from the mouth or nostril, and sometimes a fetid nasal discharge. Horses' teeth should be examined by a veterinarian at least once a year and defects cor-
