City approves budget for 1994-95 fiscal year; taxes to remain same
The Muleshoe City Coun- get includes $\$ 309,387$ for cil last Tuesday approved the proposed paving projects. fiscal year 1994-95 budget for the city.
The total budget for the city is $\$ 2,527,077$ and does not include any tax increases. The City Council voted to keep the tax rate for the coming year the same as last year's, at .6637 cents per $\$ 100$ valuation.
The new budget, however, does include an increase of \$2 a month per customer for garbage collection. It also includes an increase of .25 cents per 1,000 gallons of water.

City Manager Dave Marr said that the primary reason for the increases in garbage and water is because of the cost of compliance with state and federal regulations and unfunded mandates.

The newly-adopted bud-

The city has applied for a Community Block Development (CDBG) grant and a stipulation of the grant is that the city provide matching funds.

While the city does not know yet if it will be ap-
proved for the grant, Marr said that the money has to be
budgeted anyway.
He said the city will find
out in December if they receive the CDBG grant.

The budgetincludes total expenditures of $\$ 2,527,077$ andtotal revenues of $\$ 2,593,87$; leaving the city with revenues of $\$ 66,794$ over expenditures.
