## Muleshoe woman killed in a head-on collision

woman died following a twocar, head-on collision in Dimmitt last weekend.

Two other people are in satisfactory condition after being treated and released for injuries.

Catherine Yvonne Meiwes of Muleshoe was pronounced dead at the scene Saturday following a head-on collision with a 1973 GMC truck at 8:05 a.m.

According to a spokesperson at the Texas Highway Department in Hereford, the collision occured about 20 miles southwest of Dimmitt on County Road 629.

According to reports, Meiwes was driving a 1993 Ford pickup truck, which was westbound. The vehicle veered into the path of the GMC truck which was east bound, driven by Jerom Keeley Sewell, 24, of Blackwell, Okla.

An 18-year-old Muleshoe The vehicles collided head-on. Authorities believe glare from the sun may have contributed to the accident.

## City approves budget for 1994-95 fiscal year; taxes to remain same

The Muleshoe City Council last Tuesday approved the fiscal year 1994-95 budget for the city.

The total budget for the city is \$2,527,077 and does not include any tax increases. The City Council voted to keep the tax rate for the coming year the same as last year's, at .6637 cents per \$100 valuation.

The new budget, however, does include an increase of \$2 a month per customer for garbage collection. It also includes an increase of .25 cents per 1,000 gallons of water.

City Manager Dave Marr said that the primary reason for the increases in garbage and water is because of the cost of compliance with state and federal regulations and unfunded mandates.



Alvarado will also run the Indian offense. The ground attack in anchored by Nathaniel Flores, Chad Rosalez, Joe Armijo and Michael Franco.


Muleshoe (2-2) enters the
