

## Mules at Seminole Friday in final non-district tune-up

Friday night's game in Seminole will be the final pre-district tune up for the Muleshoe Mules and MHS head coach Randy Adair feels it's time to turn it up a notch. "This is a big game for both

schools," Adair said. "A win right now for either one of us would be a big boost going into district."

For the Mules to get the 'W', they will have to stop a Seminole team that boasts a

## Muleshoe woman killed in a head-on collision

An 18-year-old Muleshoe woman died following a two-car, head-on collision in Dimmitt last weekend.

Two other people are in satisfactory condition after being treated and released for injuries.

Catherine Yvonne Meiwes of Muleshoe was pronounced dead at the scene Saturday following a head-on collision with a 1973 GMC truck at 8:05 a.m.

According to a spokesman at the Texas Highway Department in Hereford, the collision occurred about 20 miles southwest of Dimmitt on County Road 629.

According to reports, Meiwes was driving a 1993 Ford pickup truck, which was westbound. The vehicle veered into the path of the GMC truck which was east bound, driven by Jerom Keeley Sewell, 24, of Blackwell, Okla.

The vehicles collided head-on.

Authorities believe glare from the sun may have contributed to the accident.

Catherine's sister Crystal Meiwes, 14, a passenger in the Ford pickup, was treated for broken bones at University Medical Center in Lubbock and was released.

Sewell was treated for minor abrasions at Muleshoe Area Medical Center and was also released on Saturday.

According to the spokesperson, no passengers involved in the two-car collision were wearing seatbelts at the time of the accident.

Catherine was a senior honor student at Springlake-Earth High School, where she was the drum major for the band.

She was the daughter of Steve and Jane Meiwes of Muleshoe.

## City approves budget for 1994-95 fiscal year; taxes to remain same

The Muleshoe City Council last Tuesday approved the fiscal year 1994-95 budget for the city.

The total budget for the city is \$2,527,077 and does not include any tax increases. The City Council voted to keep the tax rate for the coming year the same as last year's, at .6637 cents per \$100 valuation.

The new budget, however, does include an increase of \$2 a month per customer for garbage collection. It also includes an increase of .25 cents per 1,000 gallons of water.

City Manager Dave Marr said that the primary reason for the increases in garbage and water is because of the cost of compliance with state and federal regulations and unfunded mandates.

The newly-adopted bud-

get includes \$309,387 for proposed paving projects. The city has applied for a

Community Block Development (CDBG) grant and a stipulation of the grant is that the city provide matching funds.

While the city does not know yet if it will be ap-

proved for the grant, Marr said that the money has to be budgeted anyway.

He said the city will find out in December if they receive the CDBG grant.

The budget includes total expenditures of \$2,527,077 and total revenues of \$2,593,87; leaving the city with revenues of \$66,794 over expenditures.

team ready when they step on the field," Adair said.

Defensively, the Indians are expected to come out in a 50 front and won't try too many tricks to confuse the Mule offense.

"They run a lot of basic coverages — two deep and three deep — and they don't stunt an awful lot," Adair said.

The Indian defense is led by by senior linebacker Jamie Ray (5-9, 160). Ray was an all-district performer last year. Defensive back Jason Alvarado (5-9, 135) keys the secondary. Alvarado was also all-district last season.

Alvarado will also run the Indian offense. The ground attack is anchored by Nathaniel Flores, Chad Rosalez, Joe Armijo and Michael Franco.

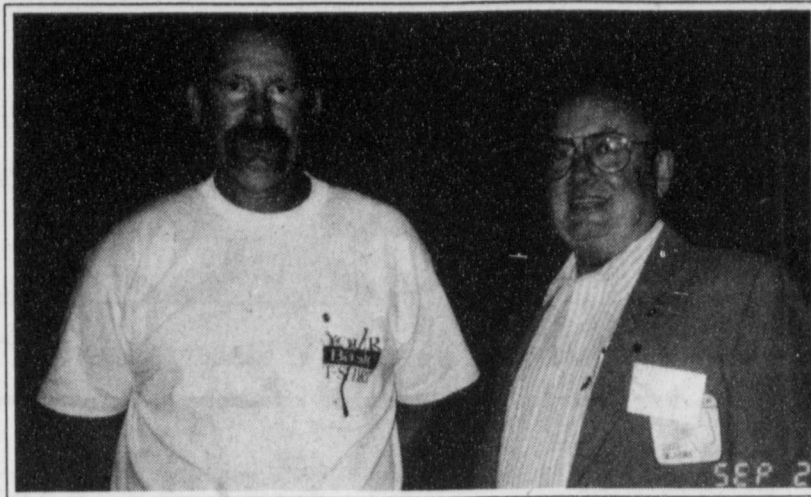
Muleshoe (2-2) enters the

Kirven's 100-yard effort was the first the normally pass-happy Mules have turned in this season. Muleshoe gained 348 yards on the ground and only attempted three passes the entire game.

Hamburgers and trimmings were prepared by Morris and Churchman.


