We have received some inquiry concerning the number and size of planting sorghum alumum.

The following information has come to us from the Panhandle Seed Company of ellington, Tex-The recommended seeding

rate is one pound per acre. The following procedure should be used to determine number of

1. Put a blank plate in your

2. Mark the plate over the spot where the seeds drop

3. Move the planter forward 18 its original starting place.

4 Drill 3-16 inch holes at each mark. Ream the holes to 1-4 inch on the under side. Do not counter

5. Sorghum Almum may be planted to approximately same depth and covering as sudan.


