Daulton R. Martin, fireman apprentice, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. John R. Martin of Silvertown is scheduled to return to the United States December 20, after spending six months in the Western Pacific aboard the aircraft carrier USS Hornet.

The Hornet operated as part of the Seventh Fleet, a major element of American seapower abroad. The ship will arrive in Long Beach, California, where it normally is homeported when not on deployment.

While in the Far East, the Hornet visited Hong Kong, the Philippines, Japan and Hawaii. During her visits to foreign ports, several thousand persons visited the ship on guided tours.
The ship was a unit of Task Force 70.4, anti-submarine warfare group.

Instead of giving two pounds per thousand, some of the local farmers have been figuring their total number of pounds of grain and paying the elevator price for the two pounds per thousand directly to the Grain Sorghum Producers Association, instead of deducting the grain from their deliveries to the elevators, according to an announcement made today by Pat Northcutt, president of the local G.S.P.

They can mark their checks "dues" in order to deduct it as an expense on their income tax returns, he reminded.
Checks should be made payable to Grain Sorghum Producers Association, and can be mailed to Lem Weaver or deposited in the account at the First State Bank in Silvertown.

Follow Rules For Lights On Outdoor Evergreens

Outdoor evergreen trees can be safely decorated with Christmas lights if a few simple guidelines are followed to avoid needle scorch.

Needles of yew, arborvitae, chamaecyparis and hemlock are sensitive to heat from bulbs. Pine, spruce and fir require the same precaution.

Bulbs of 15 wattage are sufficient. Never let the bulbs touch the needles. Hang sockets downward to prevent water and snow from collecting in them. Use rubber-jacketed or lacquered cord to connect the lights. Periodically check the position of the lights because winds may shift their position.

FIREWORKS

Fireworks, outlawed in many sections of this country, are used elsewhere in the world to signal great events. In Central America, the setting off of fireworks traditionally celebrates the birthday of Christ. Fireworks continue through the night each Christmas Eve.

When a son is born to even the poorest of families, the father will announce the event to the world by setting off the biggest firecrackers he is able to afford.

HOLIDAY MENUS

In France, after the elders return home from midnight mass, it is time for a grand feast. In some sections of the country, the roast goose occupies the center spot on the festive board. Elsewhere, the menu may be highlighted by such items as buckwheat cakes and sour cream, roasted chestnuts served with milk, turkey and chestnuts served in wine.

Many homes in France are decorated with Christmas trees, although trees are not displayed in public places to the extent one finds them in America.
