The Leg-islature shall have the power to provide by General Laws and to make payment for ments for medical care on behalf of needy individu-als sixty-five (65) years same, under such limitations of age and over who are and restrictions as may be not recipients of Old Age deemed by the Legislature ex-Assistance, and who are unable to pay for needed medical services; provid-ing for the acceptance of pedient, for direct or vendor payments for medical care on behalf of needy individuals sixty-five (65) years of age or over who are not recipients of Old Age Assistance, and Government for the Federal Government for the pur-pose of paying such medi-cal assistance; and prowho are unable to pay for
