Every year when the 4-Hers and ag boys sell their project animals, the county agents and their teachers encourage them to write letters of appreciation to the companies which bought the animals at auction.

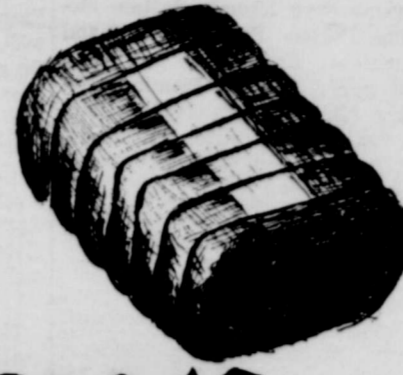
One Silverton ag boy has found that a brief but sincere thank-you note can pay unexpected dividends.

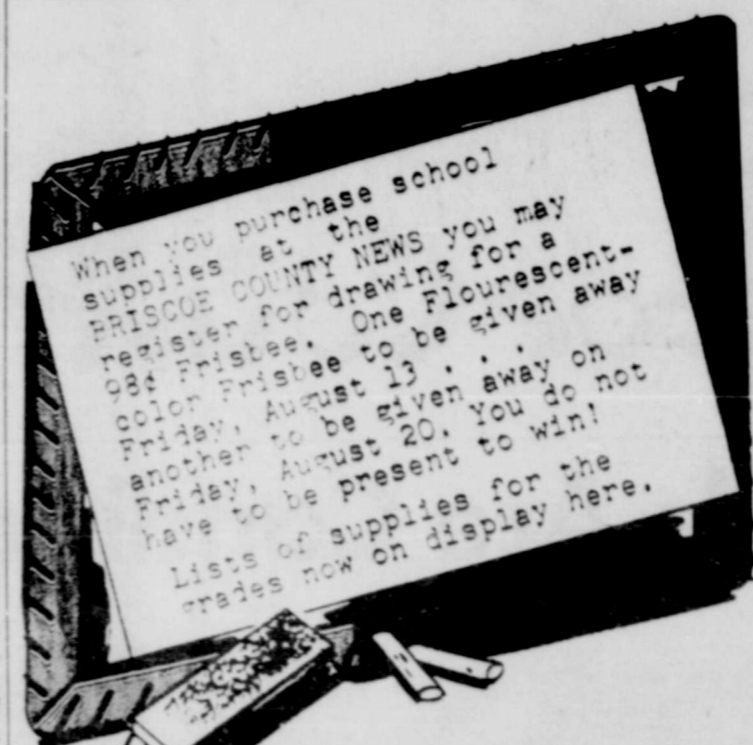

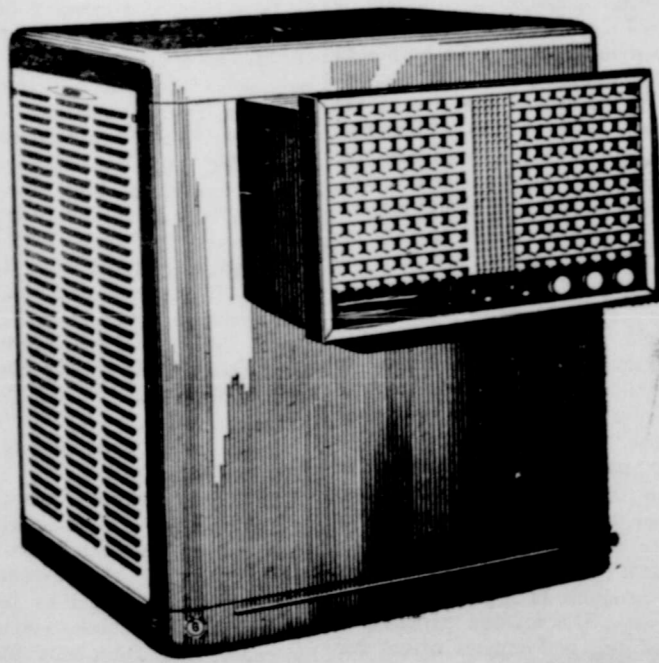
