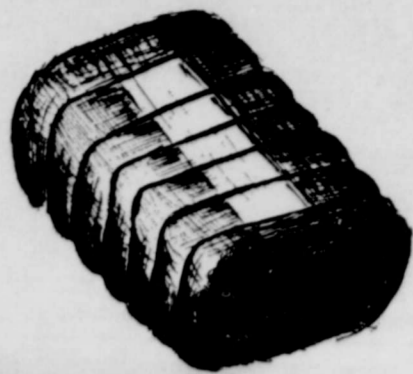

Smith Captures Briscoe County Sheriff's Race

Briscoe County Sheriff Vinson Smith was returned to office Saturday with 581 votes cast for him.

Bill Boling, with 219 votes, defeated W. E. Schott, jr., incumbent, for the office of commissioner, Briscoe County Precinct 3.

A total of 1,012 persons voted in the Democratic Primary, while 16 balloted in the Republican Primary.

Ralph W. Yarborough received 394 votes in Briscoe County, with Barefoot Sanders running second with 333 for United States Senator.

In the lieutenant governor's race, Briscoe residents gave 347 votes to Wayne Connally, 268 to 1 Ralph Hall and 186 to Bill Hobby.

John C. White received 648 votes and his opponent, Carl A. Bell, 201 for commissioner of agriculture.

Eddie J. Leary led with 469 votes for state representative of the 66th District, and Phil Cates had 383.

Self Wins Two Gold Medals At State Meet

Marvin Self ignored a rainstorm in Austin last Friday as he successfully defended his Class A State Discus Championship, and won another gold medal in hot, muggy weather as he swept the Class A State Shot Put Saturday morning.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Self, he was the high-point individual in the State Class A competition, scoring 20 points.

The discus championship was a bitter-sweet one, as the 186 1/2-pound Class A recorded eluded the Silverton High School weight man. Four times in warmups Self threw over 185', but had to settle for a career best 176'9" in the rain as he successfully defended the title he won with his then personal best of 172' a year ago.

Bathed in sunshine and muggy weather Saturday morning, Self captured the State Shot Put title which had eluded him the past two years. He recorded a put of 58'3 1/2" to win his second gold medal of the Meet. He placed third in the event in 1971.

Self set new records in most of the meets in which he competed this season, occasionally breaking a record that he had set last year. He was undefeated in both the shot and discus events until a Class AAAA competitor beat him in the shot put at the State Qualifiers' Meet in Lubbock recently with a put of 61'11". He has not had any close competition during the season, but has practiced the self discipline necessary for an athlete and his increased his distance steadily throughout the season.

the balloting, voting against the busing of school children to achieve racial balance. A total of 144 voted against the question, in effect voting for the busing of

school children.  
 On the Republican ballot, Albert Bel Fay received the most votes, 7. Two persons voted for the Daylight Saving Time referendum and 13 cast ballots against it. All 16 Republican voters were in favor of a constitutional amendment which would prohibit forced busing of school children.

Students in the seventh and eighth grades and in Silverton High School cast "sample" ballots in the mock Democratic Primary held at school last week. Their choices closely paralleled those of registered voters, as shown by the election results to be found elsewhere in this issue.

Many of the seniors who cast sample ballots at school last week were present at their voting places to "vote for real" Saturday as legally-registered 18-year-old citizens.

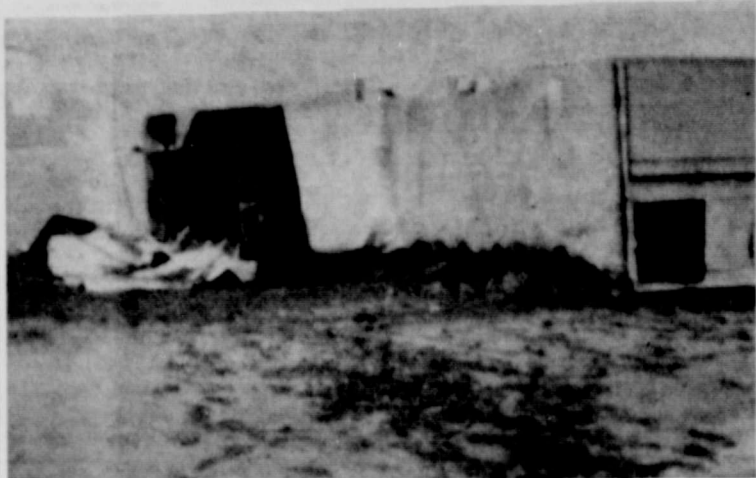

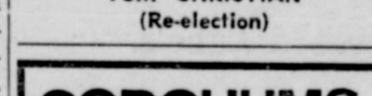

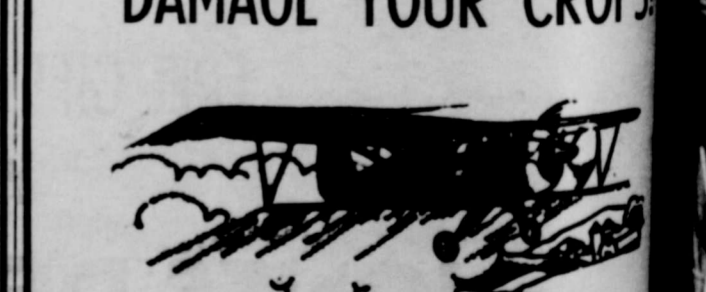
