Self Wins Two Gold Medals At State Meet

Marvin Self ignored a rainstorm n Austin last Friday as he successfully defended his Class A State Discus Championship, and won another gold medal in hot, nuggy weather as he swept the Class A State Shot Put Saturday

Son of Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Self, he was the high-point individual in the State Class A competition, scoring 20 points.

The discus championship was a bitter-sweet one, as the 186'+ Class A recorded eluded the Silverton High School weight man. Four times in warmups Self threw over 185', but had to settle for a career best 176'9" in the rain as he successfully defended the title he won with his then personal best of 172' a year ago.

Bathed in sunshine and muggy veather Saturday morning, Self aptured the State Shot Put title which had eluded him the past two years. He recorded a put of 58'31/2" to win his second gold medal of the Meet. He placed third in
