**JUNIOR OWLS RECORD 20-0  
WIN OVER VALLEY PATRIOTS**

Silverton's Junior High Owls broke a long drought by taking a big 20-0 win over the Valley Junior High Patriots here Thursday night.

Valley kicked off to the Owls, and on their first possession the

Silverton boys drove for a score. The touchdown was carried by Brent Bean with 1:29 remaining in the first period. The running conversion failed, and the Owls held a 6-0 lead.

In the second quarter, a Silverton halfback option pass thrown by Jeff Tiffin was intercepted by Valley with less than two minutes left in the half.

Valley penetrated to the Silverton-6 in the third quarter before the stubborn Owl defense tightened and refused to give up any more ground.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, Brent Bean ran to the Valley-10. Bean scored with 6:57 remaining to be played and also carried the conversion.

With 6:11 remaining to be played, Silverton recovered a Valley fumble on the Patriot-40. The final score was on a 40-yard run by Bean with less than a minute remaining to be played. The conversion failed, and the Owls had themselves a big 20-0 win.

The Owl reserves saw quite a bit of action, and recovered a Valley fumble before the game was over.

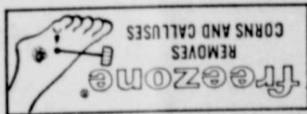

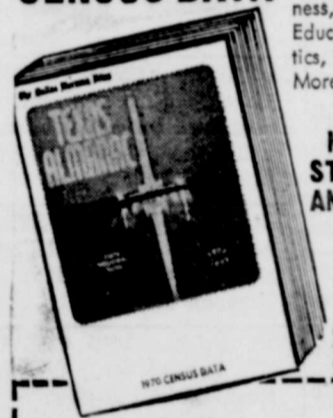

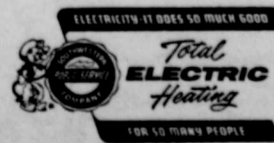
