These crashes resulted in no persons killed and no persons injured.

The rural traffic summary for this county during the first eleven months of 1972 shows a total of 37 accidents resulting in three deaths and 19 persons injured.

Records in Region 5 of the Texas Department of Public Safety show a total in November 1972 of 584 accidents, resulting in 14 persons killed and 265 persons injured as compared to the same month in 1971 with 576 accidents killed eight more accidents, six less fatalities and 27 less injured in 1972, compared to the same period of time last year.




