Don't Use Set-Aside Land Under CAP Agreement Before Notifying ASCS Office

Producers who decide to graze or hay their 1973 set-aside or CAP land are cautioned that official notification must first be given to their Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) county office.

It's very important to a producer that he give notice before using his set-aside or CAP land for haying or grazing, or allowing it to be used by another producer. Failure to go on record at the ASCS county office before his farm's set-aside or CAP acreage is grazed, hayed, or cut for silage or green chop, can cause loss of all program payments.

For producers with land in the Cropland Adjustment Program (CAP), a long-term land retirement program, the reduction for haying or grazing CAP designated acreage will be 30% of the average payment rate per acre for all acreage under CAP on the farm.

When set-aside acreage is used for livestock, the producer accepts a reduction equal to 30% of the calculated payment under the basic feed grain program. The 30% reduction applies regardless of the length of time the acreage is grazed or hayed. It applies to wheat program set-aside acreage as well as feed grain set-aside.

Your ASCS County Executive Director or any of his office staff will be happy to explain the details of the regulations, but it's vital that producers remember to notify the ASCS county office before turning livestock onto set-aside or CAP acreage or cutting it for hay, silage or green-chop.

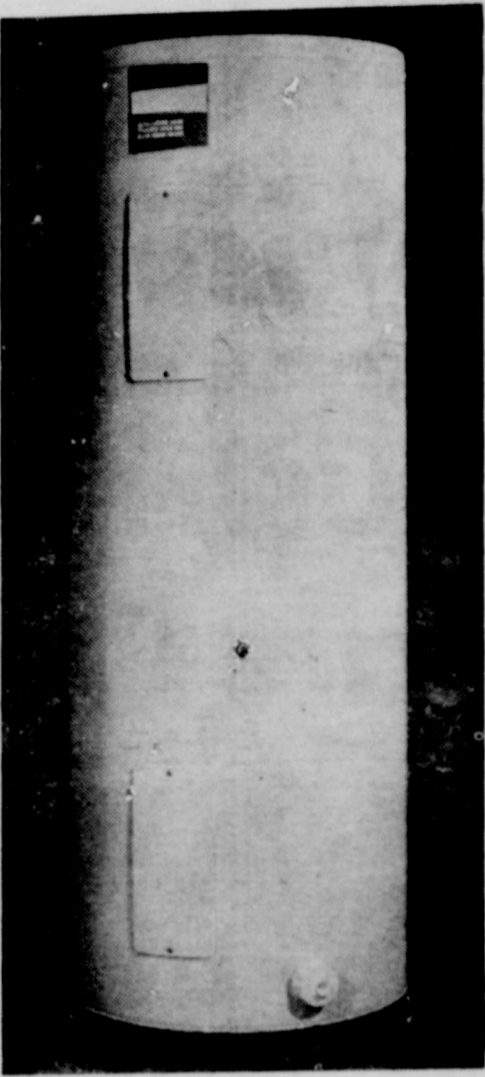

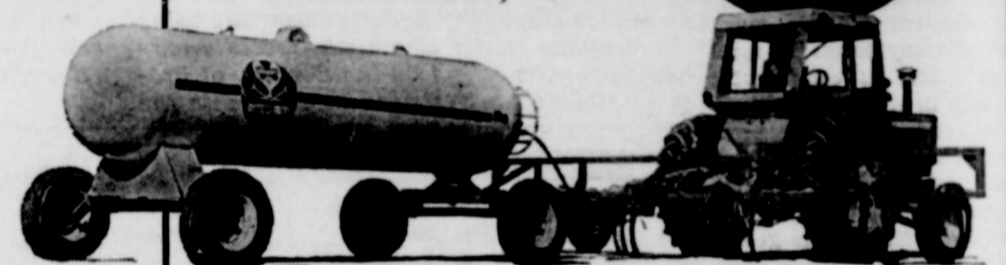
