TV DOCUMENTARY

Dr. Denton Cooley, probably the world's foremost heart surgeon, will be featured in a television documentary on Medical Center in a July or August segment. This show stars Chad Everett and he filmed this program a little over four weeks ago in Houston.

Pat and Carolyn Butler of Canyon were in the waiting room while their five-month-old son, Dusty, was having open heart surgery and were interviewed during filming of the documentary. Carolyn's family lives in Lubbock, but Pat is the son of the Loyd Butlers of Tullia, and we have known him since he was a grubby little kid.

Their son was born with a very seriously defective heart. It was thought that surgery would be postponed until he was a year old, but his condition was rapidly worsening, and it was done as an emergency measure when he was five months old. He will have to undergo surgery on his heart again, but the best side of his heart was repaired to strengthen him so he can grow and get ready to undergo the rest of the surgery.

As his mother and I discussed his situation Saturday afternoon in Lubbock, Dusty laughed, kicked, made eyes at us and snuggled in an infant seat in his mother's lap. Of course, he isn't nearly as big as other six-month-old boys, but he now has the vitality he lacked before the operation.

"Dusty didn't ever move before the surgery," his mother said. "He

Freight Train Hauling Wheat Overturms Sunday

Seven freight cars full of wheat harvested last week in Briscoe County overturned near here Saturday spilling grain along the Fort Worth and Denver spur line 10 miles southwest of town.

The derailment occurred shortly after 3:00 p.m. when an engine and 26 cars pulled out of a Silverton elevator with a full load of

wheat. A spokesman for the Fort Worth and Denver Railroad said the train was traveling southwest at about five miles an hour when it apparently crossed a weak section of track, buckling the rails. The wreck overturned seven cars in the middle of the train. The seven cars lost belonged to Silverton Elevator which had 16 cars on the freight train.

No one was injured in the mishap. Efforts to right the cars and scoop up grain were to begin Monday morning. The spur line from Silverton to Sterley had not been cleared Monday afternoon.

The train included five cars belonging to Briscoe Cooperative's Silverton elevator. Destination of the cars was Producers Grain Corporation Elevator in Plainview and a Houston based grain firm. The five cars of Briscoe Cooperative's Silverton elevator were taken on to Plainview.

George Long and Roy Montague are owners of the Silverton Elevator suffering the loss.

Surviving are two daughters, Mrs. Edith Cruce and Mrs. Elizabeth Sue Skelton, both of Lubbock; five sons, Harold L. of Fort Worth, Robert L. of Cleburne, Donald D. of Borger, Charles R. of Silverton and Jerry W. of Lubbock; a brother, O. P. Simmons of Amarillo; a sister, Mrs. Cecil Simpson of Tullia; 17 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. She was a first cousin of Bernice and Earl May of Silverton.

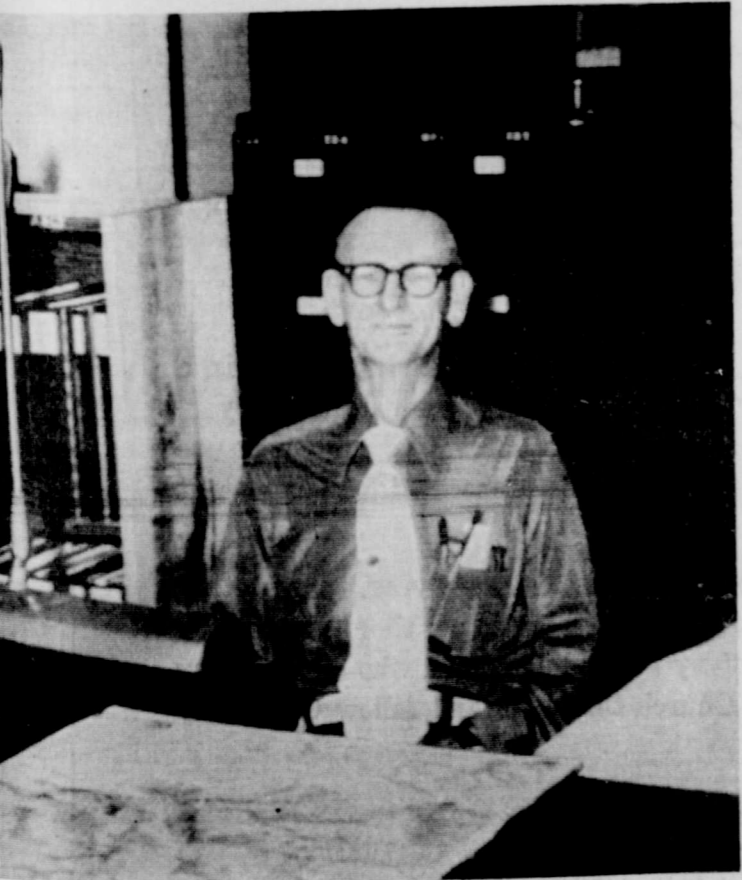
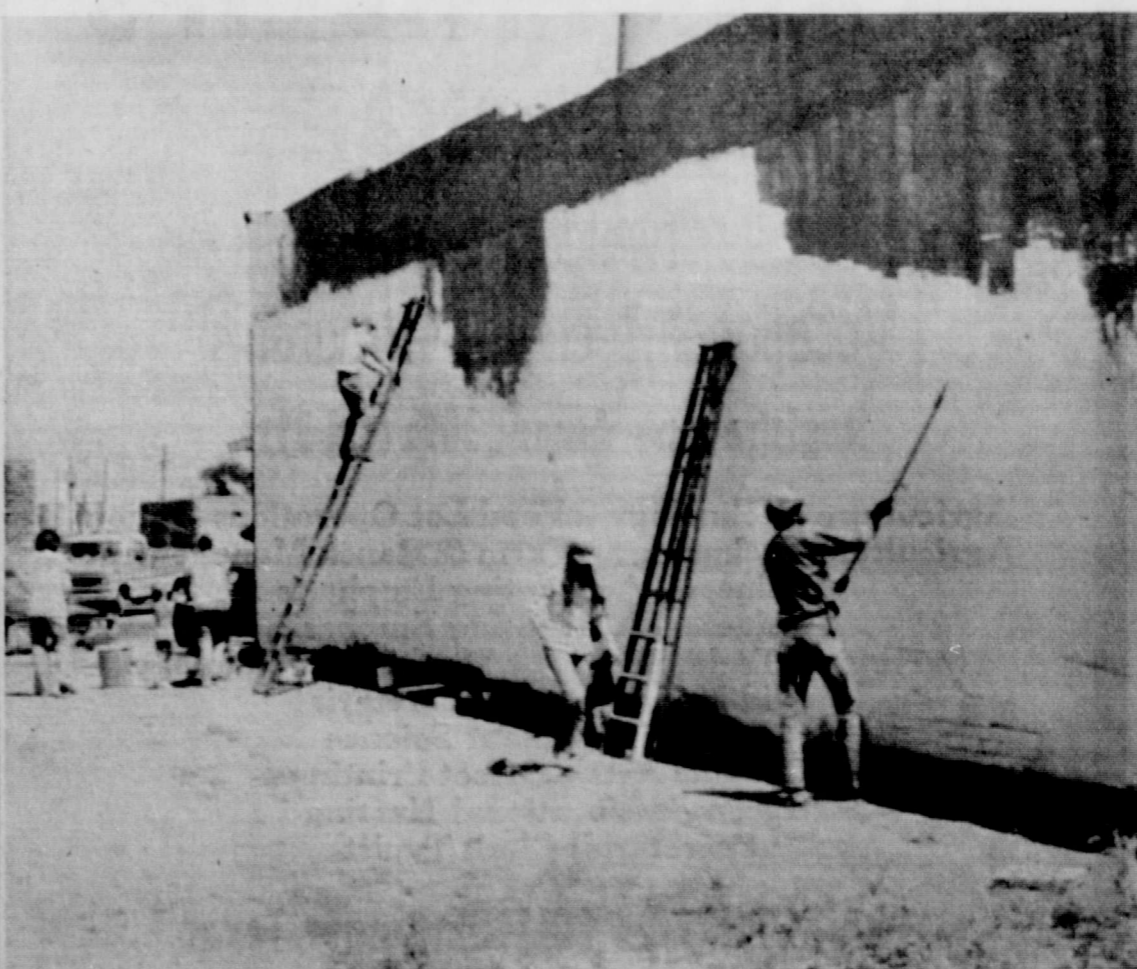
Ronald Graves came away the speediest Barrel Racer of District 2. Ronnie's time was the best of 102 contestants in the event.

just lay there. The doctor in Tullia told me he had a defective heart when he was three weeks old. He told me to watch him closely and note his breathing and other vital signs, so I spent all my time with him. He cried a lot and didn't eat very much.

"There has been such a change in him since his surgery. He was already eating better before we brought him home from Houston. The first day we were home he had his foot in his mouth and was chewing on his toes. The second day he turned himself over, and the third day he cut his first tooth."

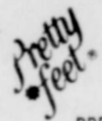
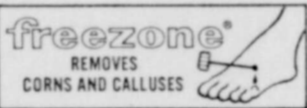
About the television filming, Carolyn had this to say: "I didn't even fix myself up before we went to the hospital that morning. I was so worried about Dusty that I didn't care what I wore or anything. The surgery started at 6:30 in the morning and was over about 9:00. In the meantime, they asked if we would take part in the filming of the documentary and we agreed. We had to sign releases and everything, and the television cameras were brought into the waiting room. Chad Everett was there, and you won't believe it but he is handsomer in person than he is on TV! He is just an ordinary person, and when you talk to him, he listens as if you were the only person in the world! They had been doing the first of the two-part program on Dr. DeBakey at another hospital. Of course, Dr. DeBakey is good, but we think Dr. Cooley is the best there is!"

While Dusty was in intensive care following the surgery, they were allowed to see him only ten minutes every four hours. He was in a jungle of tubes, part of which were inserted into his head. Now all the painful ordeal seems worthwhile to the Butlers who are happy to have a happy, relaxed, hungry Dusty at home once again. Except for the surgical scars and having to pick him up in a special way, the experience has become more like a terrible nightmare than anything else, and Pat and Carolyn are looking forward to seeing themselves on television.

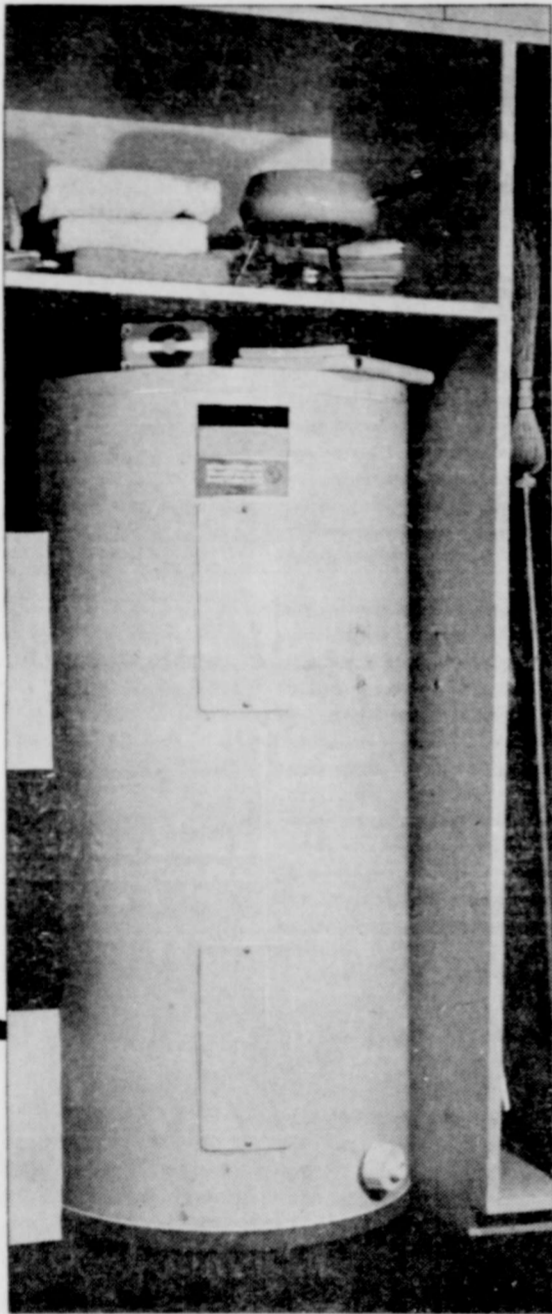

## Follow The Signs

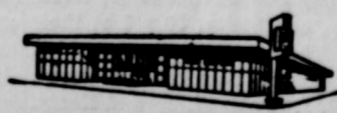

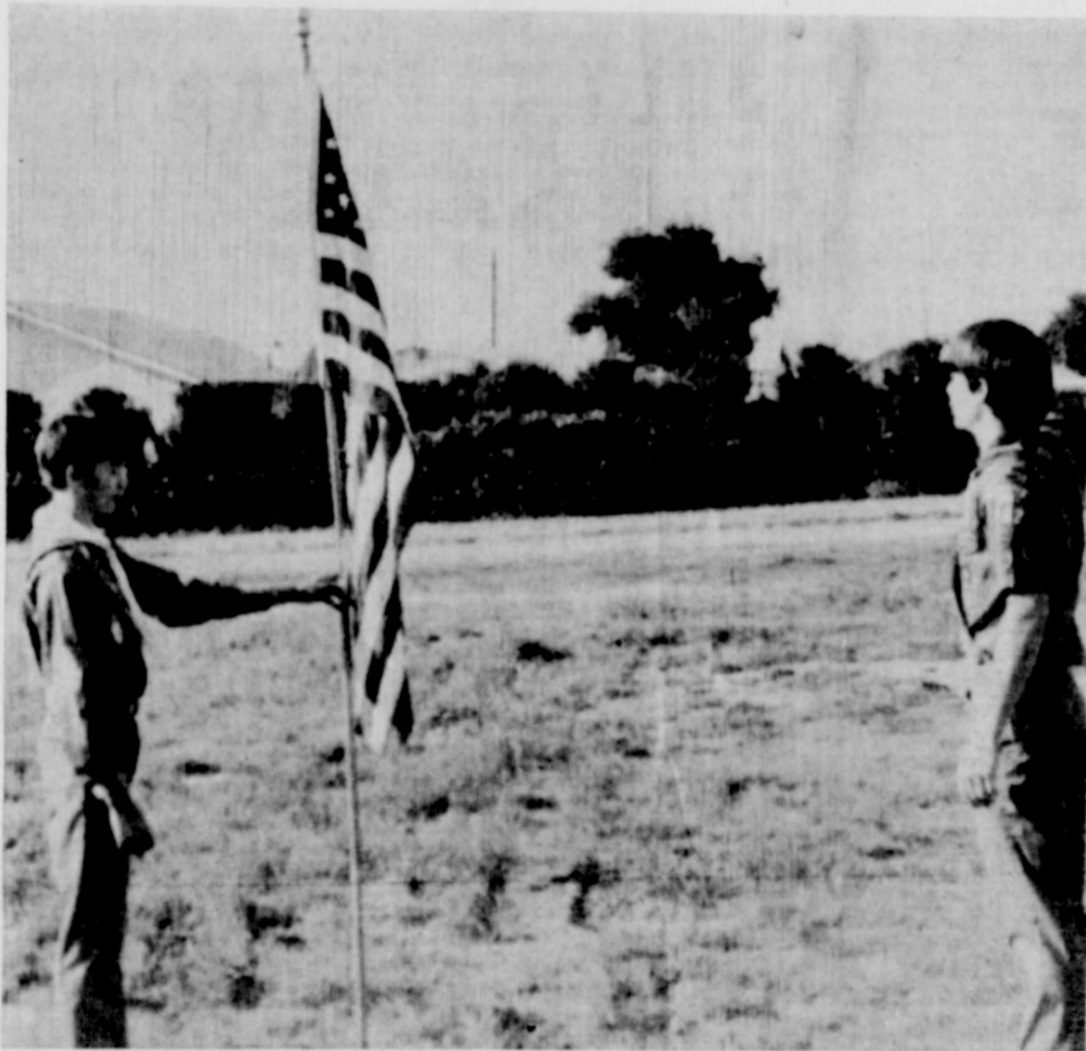
