

Leaves are the food factories of the plant. In the presence of sunshine, they combine carbon dioxide from the air and water, nitrates, and minerals from the soil to make plant food. The roots gather raw material, water, nitrates and minerals which are converted into plant food by the leaves. Roots also serve as storehouses for food. This food is essential for regrowth.

Nature gives you about 50% of the total volume of growth of a plant for the production of livestock and livestock products. The rest belongs to the land and the plant for grass insurance. This insurance provides for erosion control, soil fertility maintenance, water conservation, stabilized soil temperatures, plant development and reproduction. 




