J. B. Cranfill of Dallas writes an article under the caption of "A political conspiracy," appearing in the Dallas News of Oct. 23, in which he tells about a conversation he had with Hon. Samuel W. Dickie of Al- bion, Mich., an old time friend of his. Mr. Dickie is a republican and is now president of the Albion Uni-

versity. Mr. Dickie told me, that "When Senators Knox, Brandegee and Lodge, together with some others of their republican confreres, met to deliberate concerning the League of Nations and treaty of Peace. Said the principal address was made by Senator Lodge himself, who said to these Republican Senators in substance as follows:

"President Wilson has brought back from France the most important State Document ever formulated in the history of the world. If the senate of the United States ratifies this League of Nations covenant and treaty of peace, it will be known, heralded and accorded as an achievement of the Democratic party. As republicans we cannot allow this to occur. For such an instrument of such world-wide importance to be ratified and chronicled as the achievement of a Democratic president and a Democratic administration, would cast a blight upon the Republican party and its future that would keep us in the background perhaps for years. Our only remedy is to kill the League of Nations and treaty of peace, and in order to do this we must eliminate President Wilson."

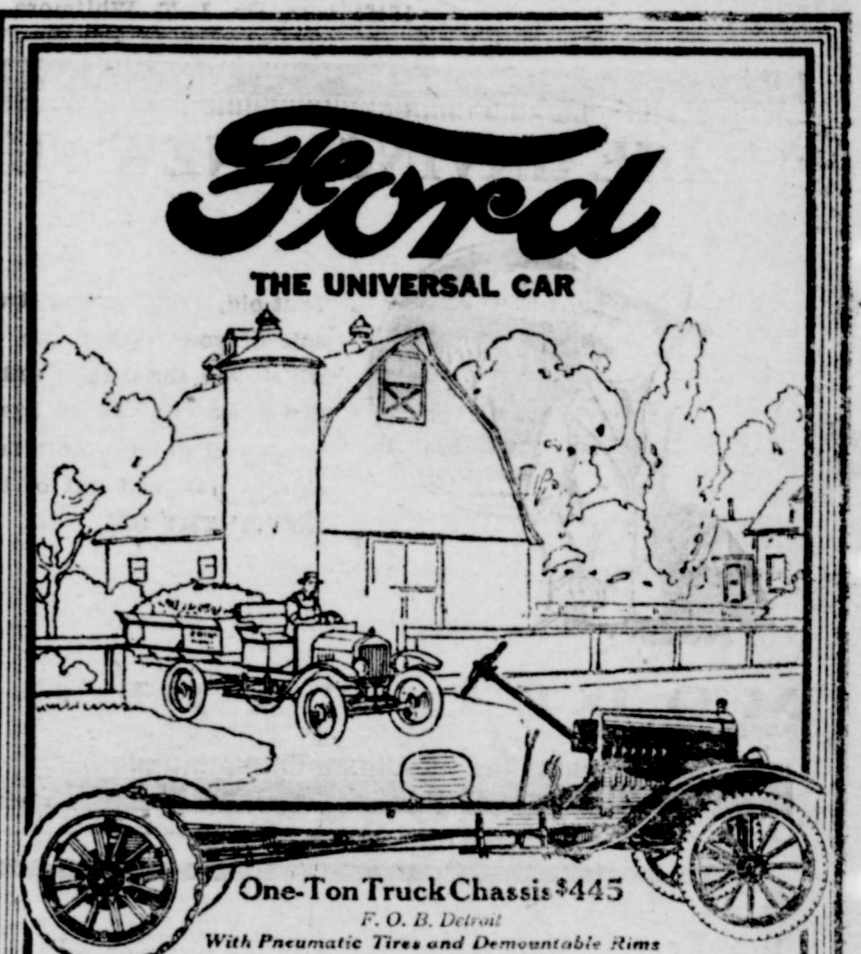

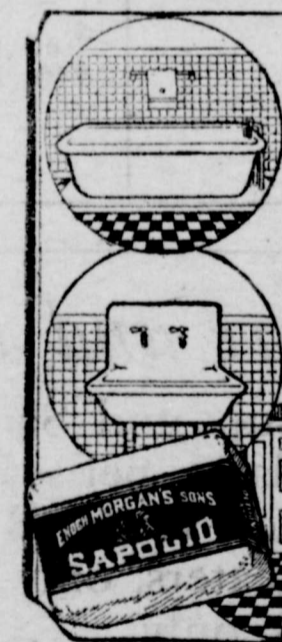
