"Recognition of the falsity of material wealth as the standard of business goes hand in hand with the abandonment of the false belief that public office and high political position are to be valued only by the standards of price of place and personal profit.

Action Now! "Restoration calls, however, not for changes in ethics alone. This nation asks for action, and action now.

"Our greatest primary task is to put people to work. This is no unresolvable problem if we face it wisely and courageously. It can be accomplished in part by direct recruiting by the government itself, treating the task as we would treat the emergency of a war...

"Hand in hand with this we must frankly recognize the over-balance of population in our industrial centers and, by engaging on a national scale in a re-distribution, endeavor to provide a better use of the land for those best fitted for the land.
