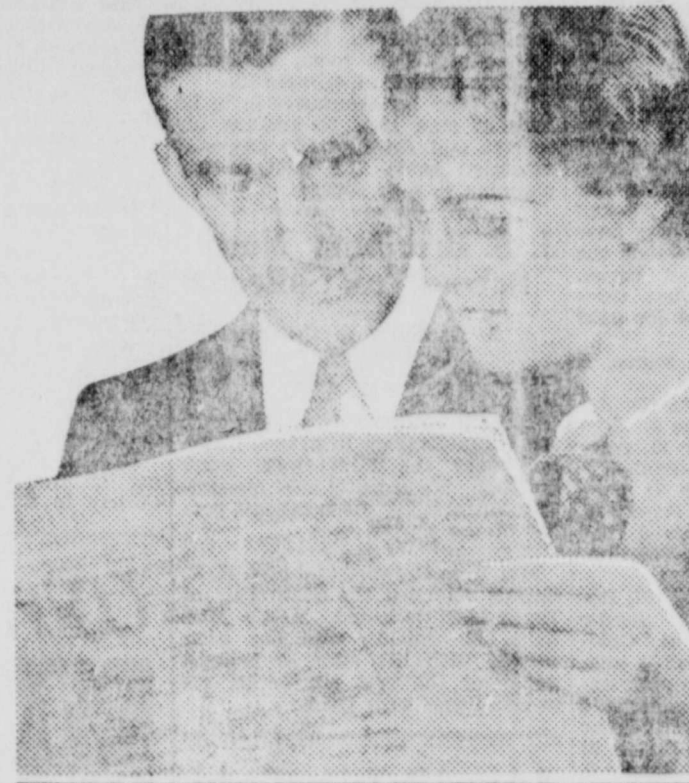
THE OUTLOOK FOR AGRICULTURE.
