When reworking an old established iris bed, select only the strong, healthy rhizomes for replanting. Discard any diseased or stunted plants.

When you plant the rhizome, build a cone shaped mound of soil in the bottom of the hole so that the top of the cone is almost even with the surface of the surrounding soil. Place the rhizome on top of the cone with the roots spreading down around the cone. Shallow planting is best, with the rhizomes set. just below the soil surface.

There are only two reasons to trim off iris foliage: to prepare plants for digging and transplanting, and to remove foliage that is badly infected with disease. At transplanting time, cut back the foliage to one-third its original height. In established beds, leave the foliage as it is necessary to build up food reserves needed to produce the
