

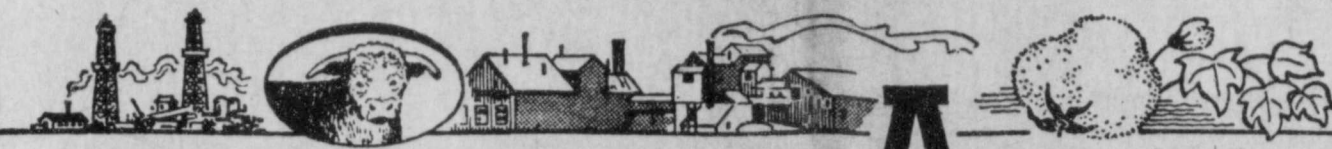

Roby Man Dies In Sunday Shooting

Charges have been filed against a Sweetwater man and his son in connection with the shooting death of Ignacio B. Martinez, 42, of Roby, who was killed about 11:52 p. m. Sunday in an altercation at the American GI Forum on Robert Lee St., Sweetwater.

Rudolph M. Ybarra, 41, and his son Danny O. Ybarra, 19, were both charged with murder with malice in justice of the Peace Ralph Shaffer's Court. Bond has been set at \$10,000 and the men were being held in Nolan County Jail Monday night in lieu of bond.

Funeral service was held at 3:30 Wednesday from St. Joseph Catholic Church with Rev. Robert Dillendick officiating. Burial was in Roscoe Cemetery.

He was born in Kames City in 1928, and came to Haskell about 1959. He married Virginia Rodriguez in Haskell July 14, 1959. He moved to Fisher County in 1965 and had farmed for Max Carrier five miles east of Roby since that time. He was a member of the Catholic Church.

Reports late Tuesday gave his condition as much improved and that he sat in a chair Monday. Mrs. Rodgers is with him.

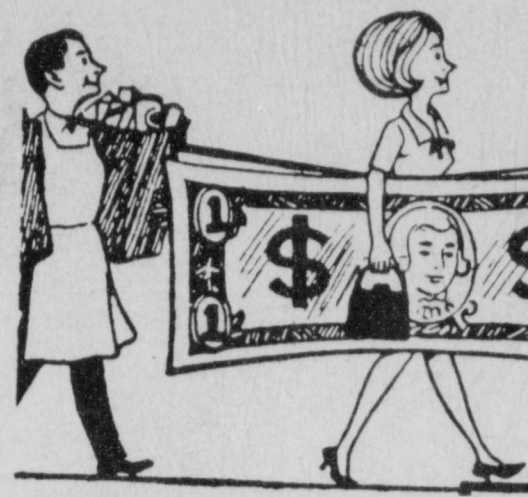
Justice of Peace Jeff Simmons pronounced Mr. Sanders dead at the scene.

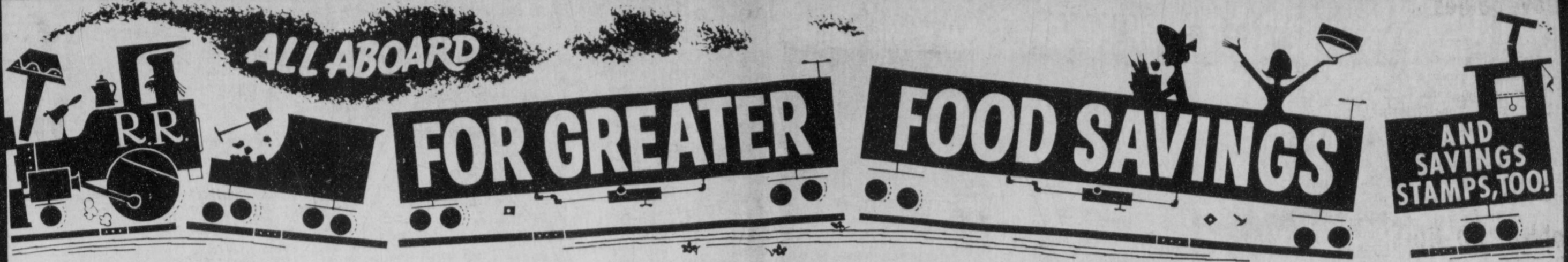

He says that today's heart transplants are just one step in the inexorable march of surgical science toward undreamed of possibilities. He believes that all human beings are essentially good until they go out of their way to prove themselves bad.

"My philosophy can be summed in the words of this little poem," he says: "Life's battle doesn't always go to the stronger and faster man. Sooner or later the man who wins, is the fellow who thinks he can." You'll find many of Dr. Barnard's beliefs at the church where you worship this week.
