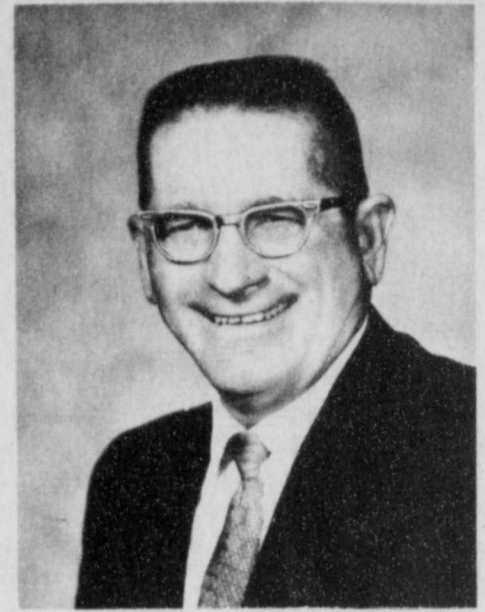

Ralph Ammons
Appointed**



COIN FLIP DECIDES NEW FISHER COUNTY JUDGE

Judge E. G. Perkins asked for everyone's attention, firmly addressed the two applicants for Fisher County Judge, and said "call it".

Ralph Ammons called "heads" and was thus appointed Judge. Fate and the flip of a twenty-five cent piece made the decision for the four County Commissioners who were deadlocked on two choices.

The Commissioners narrowed the field of nine to Ralph Ammons and Dwight Lovett on Monday morning. Thurman Terry making a motion to appoint Ammons, seconded by A. J. Ford and Earl Kiker making the motion to appoint Lovett, seconded by Wayne Porter.

With the four commissioners hopelessly deadlocked Monday morning at 11:00, a motion was made to leave the court open until Tuesday morning at 9:30 when both Ammons and Lovett would be asked to appear before the court.

The two applicants agreed to let the fickle flip of a coin decide the destiny of the county judgeship. The winner to have his option of accepting or withdrawing and the loser

agreeing to withdraw should the winner choose to serve.

Ralph Ammons got the call and hollered "heads", Perkins tossed the coin and it came up heads. Ammons' first statement was that he "would try to serve to the very best of his ability".

Ammons will take office on July 1st. This will be the first public office he has held, however, he has many years experience as a school board member, church official board member and long record as a successful businessman.

Ammons was born March 3, 1915 and has lived most of his life within the city limits of Roby. He is the major stockholder of Roby Hydro Inc., a Fisher County butane business.

He attended Texas Tech in Lubbock for 3 years and married his wife, Marie, in 1939. Mr. and Mrs. Ammons have three children.

Their oldest daughter, Reatha Myrle Baker and her husband reside in Denver, Colorado; Karyl Lee Simmons and her husband reside in Pecos and the only son, John Michael is a junior at Texas Tech.

Ammons remarked that he "did not want to see this appointment have to be made by someone out of Fisher County". Had the commissioners remained deadlocked, some high state official would have had to make the decision on who would be appointed judge.

Before Ammons ever left the Court House with the good news of his appointment, he made the remark that "I am going to give full time to County Judge". He also indicated that he would sell his business interests if he should win the races coming up.

The new County Judge taught school for 4 years before serving in the Air Force as

a B-29 pilot. He was discharged with the rank of major.

Ammons served 11 years on the Roby Independent School Board and has been on the official board of the Methodist Church since coming back to Roby after being discharged from the Air Force. He is the past president of the Roby Lions Club and has served two terms as a director of the Texas Butane Association.

In the two days that the Commissioners Court was open the decision on the new County Judge was not the only topic discussed. The commissioners passed a motion to remove the county telephone from the residence of Deputy Sheriff M. A. Hughes.

They voted to leave the present tax rate on vehicles at 95¢ per \$100.00 valuation.

One of the final items was to authorize the County Auditor to hire extra help as needed in the auditor's office.

ROTAN PRINCIPALS GET PAY INCREASE

School Board members of the Rotan Independent School District deliberated for some time Monday night on a recommendation by Superintendent K. C. McCasland to adjust the principals pay, but finally passed the recommendation after a lengthy discussion.

McCasland recommended the high school principal be paid on an 11-1/2 month basis and the junior high and primary principal be paid on an eleven month basis.

The new teacher pay raise upped the teachers pay from 9 to 10 months and increased the work load 15 days. Prior to the pay raise the teachers were paid on 9 months and principals on 10 months. During the past school year both teachers and principals were paid on a 10 month basis.

The new increase passed by the board will take effect September 1st.

The motion to adjust the principals salary as recommended by McCasland was made by Dr. Jerry Marshall and seconded by Dwight Nowlin.

Gruben and seconded by Bobby Smith. It unanimously passed. Dick Edwards and Bobby Smith made and seconded a motion to name the First National Bank of Rotan as the school depository.

Bobby Gruben made a motion that was seconded by Dick Edwards to comply with Public Law 91230 requiring that the school make the Title 1 program ac-

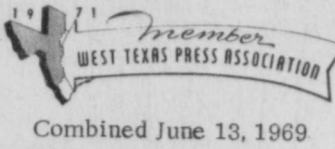

COUNTY AGENT NEWS

Did you ever stop to think how much a rural community loses when it raises a farm boy or girl only to have him move away to the city as soon as he reaches a productive age?

Young people do move about. According to a U. S. census report, 44% of all young adults (20 to 24 years of age) moved between March 1968 and March 1969. This does not include students temporarily living away from home at college unless their families moved; neither does it include armed forces personnel living on post without families. It would be safe to figure that of the 44% who changed residence, a majority of them moved from a rural to an urban area.

What sort of monetary loss does a rural community suffer when it kisses goodbye a farm-raised boy or girl who leaves to seek his fortune in the city? You get a rough measure of this loss by figuring what it costs to raise a child to 18 years of age.

On a Southern farm the cost of raising a child to 18 years of age at 1969 prices on a moderate cost level ranges from \$29,080 in a five-child family to \$37,600 in a two-child family. If costs are at a low level, then total for the 18 years ranges from \$19,000 to \$26,000 depending on size of family.

We wonder if city people, particularly city and chamber of commerce officials, ever give rural areas credit for this huge subsidy of manpower (or brainpower, if you prefer) they receive from their country neighbors.

Cattle grubs cost the Texas livestock industry several million dollars each year. Losses to this pest are an important economic consideration in Fisher County.

Losses occur at all levels in the production and marketing chain. The cow-calf producer is concerned about reduced milk production by the mother cows and resulting reduced weaning weights of calves. The feeder suffers losses as a result of reduced gains and lowered market price for grubby animals.

The packer who buys and slaughters grubby animals realizes hide losses, carcass trim, increased handling costs and lowered carcass value. Therefore, cattle grub control deserves the attention of the entire beef industry.

Cattle grubs can be effectively controlled through the use of systemic insecticides. Depending upon the operation, systemic insecticides can be administered as dips, sprays, backline pour-ons, mineral mixes or feed additives. Cost of these treatments vary

with the method and chemical selected, but generally, ranges less than 50 cents per animal in most instances.

A listing of chemicals and livestock insecticides, we strongly recommend that labels be read and particular attention be given to the precautions and restrictions listed. Also to follow to the letter, slaughter intervals as clearly stated on the label.

In early July, some 22,000 Texas farmers will receive an acreage and production of selected crops questionnaire from Cary D. Palmer, Agriculture Statistician for the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service in Austin.

This information will be the basis for determining harvested acreage and production of early harvested crops for the State of Texas and for each county. There are 254 counties in Texas and reports are needed from many farmers so that each county will be well represented. Accurate estimates are of great importance to farmers in planning production and marketings and in an unbiased picture of Texas agriculture.

The Texas Legislature has provided a program of estimates for each county. Texas covers such a wide area that State to-

als alone do not provide adequate information on Texas' most basic industry-agriculture. This is a cooperative effort of USDA's Statistical Reporting Service and the Texas Department of Agriculture.

While job offers for college graduates are generally running below normal this spring, the Texas Maritime Academy had almost 50 percent more offers than it had graduating seniors to fill them.

The academy's 21 spring graduates received starting salaries averaging \$1,200 per month.

Recruiters came to TMA from Washington and other East Coast cities, as well as from throughout the Gulf Coast area.

One oil company hired eight TMA graduates this spring. Federal government jobs were offered by the Military Sea-Lift Command and the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers.

TMA, part of Texas A&M University, is one of six major facilities of its type in the nation. It was established in 1962.

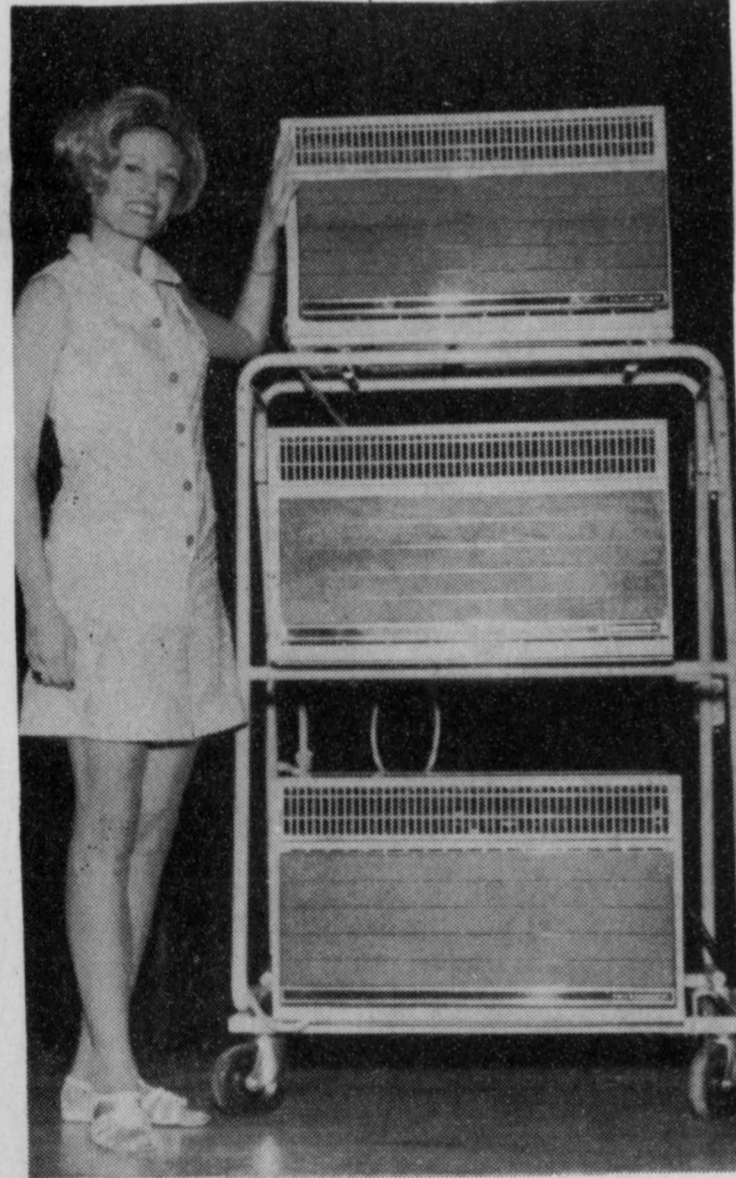

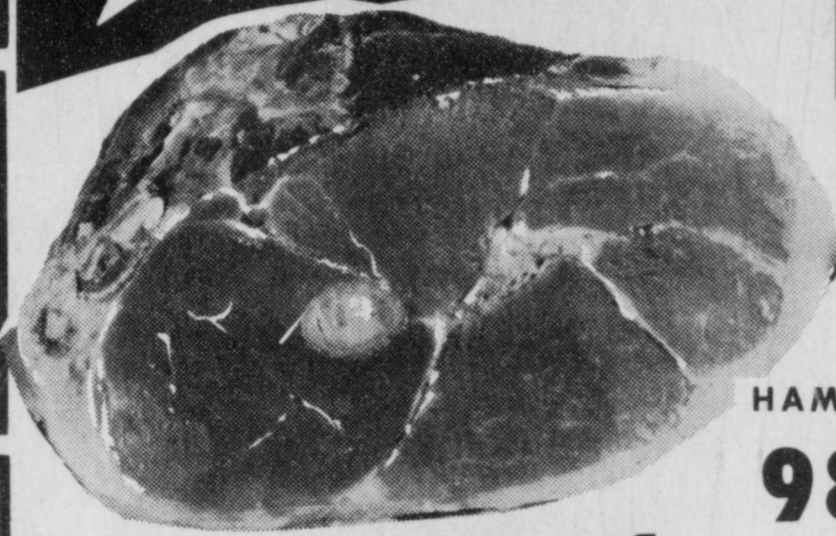
