## Cecil Champion Finishes Watch Repair School

Cecil Champion of Champion Jewellery in Rotan, has attended and completed a special course in electronic timekeeping conducted by Bulova Watch Company. The intensive program is designed for the professional watchmaker who handles the Accutron watch, the world's first tuning-fork timepiece for wrist use.

Today Accutron tuning-fork movements, made in the United States, are the only watch movements on the Moon. They are in timers emplaced on the Moon by Apollo 11, 12 and 14 astronauts. Champion reports. A clock version is used as the master timer aboard Nomad, the world's first computerized buoy, which broadcasts weather information from its position off Cape Hatteras, the storm center of the Western Atlantic.

"This transistorized watch uses a tiny tuning-fork as its time base," Champion said. "The fork

vibrates 360 times a second. That's 144 times as fast as the balance wheel oscillates in conventional electronic watches—making possible an average in-use accuracy to within 2 seconds a day on the wrist. The same accuracy is maintained by the Accutron timers on wood elk being tracked in Yellowstone National Park by orbiting NASA satellites. That timer turns on and off a small radio to coincide with the scheduled "passes" overhead of the satellites—thus conserving the power supply of the radio."

Servicing the revolutionary timepiece requires special training, he added, because the movement uses components, including a transistorized electronic circuit, not found in conventional watches. The Accutron watch, he noted, is the only U.S. developed watch now sold around the world by jewelers. Bulova, he explained, is the sole

remaining domestic manufacturer of jeweled-movement watches in the United States. A jeweled movement is one with tiny pin-head size synthetic rubies at all key friction points, to minimize friction and assure long, efficient operating life.

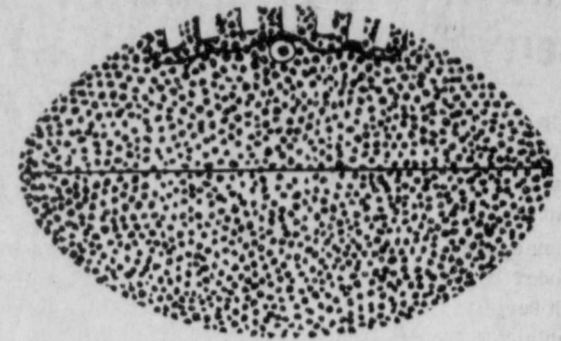

## COTTON INSECT REPORT

by Gary Floyd

From August 16 to August 20, we saw boll weevil damage of 20 to 40% in the shinnery belt east of Rotan and Roby and in the Royston area. There was some bollworm damage in all parts of the county. However, no definite trend could be established. Also, boll weevil buildups were found in spotted areas in the earlier cotton away from the over-wintering belt ranging from 10 to 20% punctured squares.

From August 23 to August 27 we saw a new crop of weevils hatch out and start feeding. Punctured square counts remained about the same. Bollworm damage counts started down during the latter part of the week.

From August 30 to September 3, we saw a marked increase in punctured squares with counts in the shinnery belt going as high as 63%. In areas that had weevil damage of 0 to 4% before, the damage rose from 2 to 14%. Bollworm damage came down more and very few small worms or eggs were located.

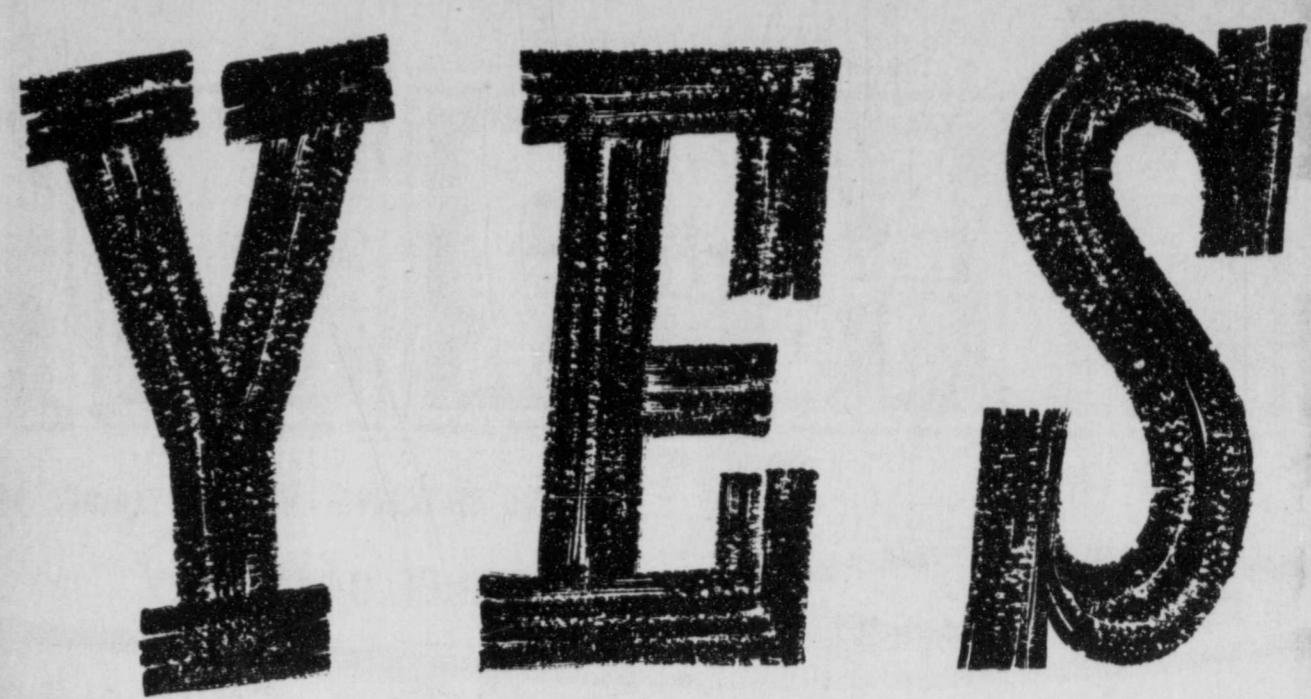
