# COMMISSIONERS AND ARCHITECT DISCUSS COURT HOUSE PLANS IN SPECIAL SESSION

The Fisher County Commissioners met in special session at 9:00 a. m. Tuesday morning, December 7, to meet with architect and work on plans for new court house.

All talk at the meeting centered around the plans that were presented to the Commissioners by Max Lovett, representing Lov-

ett & Sellers, architects, at an earlier Commissioners meeting.

The motion to open the court was made by Thurman Terry and seconded to A. J. (Blackie) Ford.

Max Lovett opened the discussion with a remark to the effect that the Commissioners needed to start planning the di-

rection in which they wanted to follow.

He made some suggestions concerning the need for vault space in the district clerk's office and also mentioned that the present plans did not include the County Treasurer.

The plan that Lovett and the Commissioners discussed was

the plan that was published on the front page of this newspaper several weeks ago. This plan called for an estimated cost of construction between \$350,000 and \$370,000.

Suggestions were made concerning the need for study with reference to a wheel chair approach to one of the court house

entries.

Judge Ammons made the recommendation that Lovett study the feasibility of reducing the size of the County Veteran Officer's office. It was felt that this office could be reduced in size and the added space made more beneficial in another area.

Judge Ammons is aware of

some grants that are available for fallout shelters and asked Lovett to study this possibility before their next meeting.

Max Lovett informed the Commissioners that he would recommend a survey and soil investigation before too long. Lovett informed the court that the roll investigation would cost in the vicinity of \$1,200 to \$1,500, but that it could be a saving in knowing what type specifications to call for on the concrete foundation.

Commissioner Kiker asked Lovett what his fee as an architect would be. Lovett indicated that in the light of the fee recommended by the Texas Society of Architects, he would ask \$8%. This is not to say that he was employed at 8% because a contract has not been signed for the construction as yet.

Lovett did say that his fee was figured in the estimated cost that he presented to the Commissioners.

Lovett stressed that his firm provided a complete service. The design, working drawings, specification preparation, bid

sets, bid acceptance, contract execution and construction supervision are all accomplished by Lovett & Sellers.

Nothing was officially voted on at the meeting, it was called primarily to give the Commissioners an opportunity to suggest

changes in the basic plan so Max Lovett could further proceed with the final court house construction plans.

The next regular meeting of the Fisher County Commissioners Court will be held at 9:00 a. m. on Monday, December 13th.

The Roby City Council met last Monday afternoon for their regular monthly meeting. Only routine business was discussed, with the exception of raising the three city employee's salaries in line with the recent 5.5% wage

requirements set by the Federal Government.

Present for the meeting of the Roby City Council were Mayor Cecil King, and councilmen Jimmy Price and Jimmy Hayes.

The councilmen also passed on increasing the dues paid to the West Texas Chamber of Commerce. The present dues are \$25.00 and will be increased to \$30.00 in the future.

The next regular meeting will be held on January 10, according to Mayor King.

### Majority Cotton Selling Between 26¢ & 28¢ Pound

Rain and cold weather halted the cotton harvest in the Abilene territory according to the USDA, Consumer and Marketing Service.

B. B. Manly, Jr., Officer - In-charge of the Abilene Classing Office reports that 4,700 samples were classed for the week ending December 3. This brings the seasons total to 10,500 samples classed compared to 242,000 for a seasons total a year ago.

Thirty-nine percent of the samples classed were in the white category, 55 percent were light spotted, with Midling Light Spotted the predominant grade at 30 per cent.

Staple lengths were 16 per cent, 30; 38 per cent, 31; and 31 per cent, 32.

Micronaire readings were in the premium range on 62 per cent of the samples.

Strength readings have been very discouraging thus far this year.

The majority of the cotton in the area is still selling for 26.00 to 28.00 cents.

### County Hits 74 Percent Of Goal On Savings Bond

Mr. R. L. Springer, Chairman of the Fisher County Savings Bonds Committee, has announced that United States Savings Bond sales in Fisher county totaled \$2,950 during October. Sales for the ten month period were \$37,188 with 74 per cent of the 1971 sales goal.

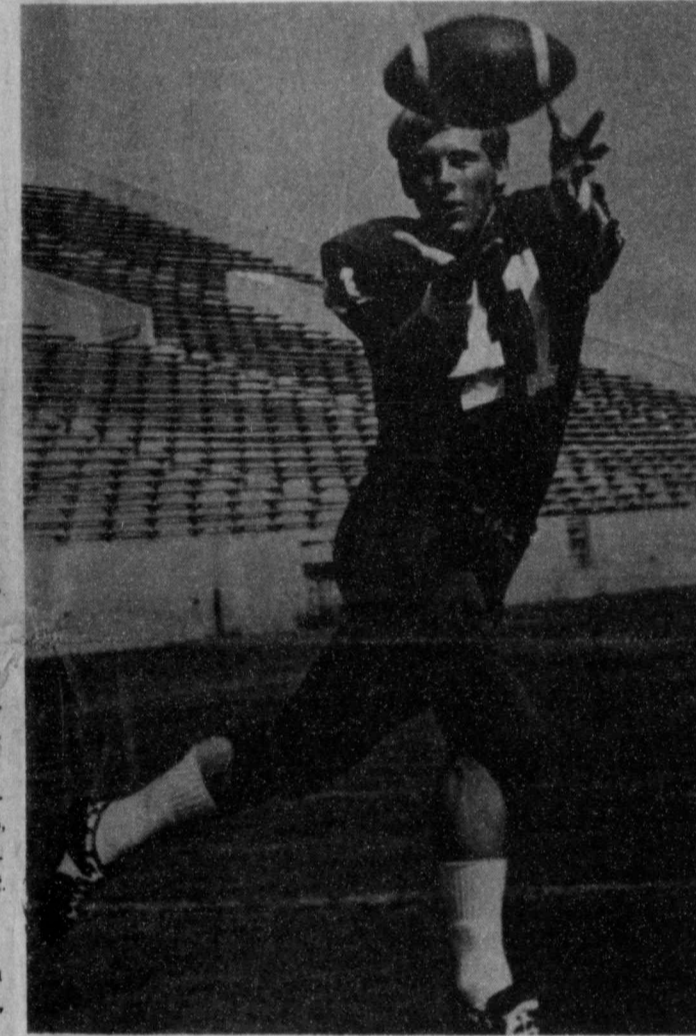
Series E and H Savings Bond sales in Texas during October were \$15,480,457. Sales for the first ten months of 1971 totaled \$167,863,056 which represents a 10.4 percent increase over the same period last year.

Nationwide, sales were \$407 million during the month, unchanged from the same month a year ago. Redemptions were 10 percent below last year's and the least for any October since 1962.

Nicky Pruitt, senior running-back ended his career with the Abilene Christian College Wildcats, finished his career as one of the top all-around performers for a long time in Wildcat football.

"Nifty" Nicky closed the year with 363 yards rushing on 81 carries for a 4.5 yard average to pace the team in that category and also ranked first in scoring with 54 points on nine touchdowns. Pruitt, who started the year as a wide receiver, also ranked third in pass receiving with 14 catches for 300 yards and his 21.4 mean paced the team.

The 5-10, 185-pounder who played his high school ball for six-man Sidney, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Pruitt of Roby. His father is the superintendent of schools in Roby.

### County FM 3205 Will Get Work

Contracts for highway construction in the Abilene district have been awarded by the Texas Highway Commission.

The work will be under the supervision of District Engineer J. C. Roberts and will be in Borden, Fisher and Taylor Counties. Zack Burkett Company of Graham was awarded a contract for grading, structures base and surfacing on 4.1 miles of FM 3205 in Fisher County. Low bid was \$108,861.73.

The project extends from FM 611, 9.0 miles west of Rotan, to 4.1 miles northwestward. R. R. Wilkinson of Colorado City is the Highway Department engineer in charge of the project which will take an estimated 110 working days.

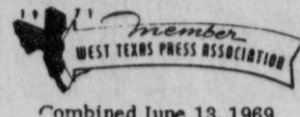

## Fiberglass In Roby Planning Big Expansion

Fiberglass Manufacturing Co. of Roby is enlarging its plant facilities to make room for an additional line of products.

When the firm moved to Roby they manufactured dune buggies and farm buildings. Later chemicals spray tanks, automatic watering troughs, water hauling tanks, molasses feeders and fishing boats were added.

Some of the newer items being made are camper shells, showers and tub-shower combinations for homes and house trailers.

They also do repair and custom work on items ranging from baptistries to locker plant wall panels, to feed troughs and cow heads for ropers.

## Conservation And Wildlife Compliment Each Other

"Wildlife habitats can be improved when conservation practices are applied to improve and protect cropland and rangeland," stated Gerald Harmon, Soil Conservationist with the Soil Conservation Service, Rotan.

Harmon continued, "Conservation goes hand in hand with providing the type of habitat needed by most wildlife. For instance, a conservation cropping system, which consists of growing soil improving crops such as small grain or sorghum in rotation with cotton, provides a source of food for game birds such as dove and quail. This residue from these crops when left on the surface of the soil helps to control erosion which is a major cause of pollution in ponds, lakes and streams."

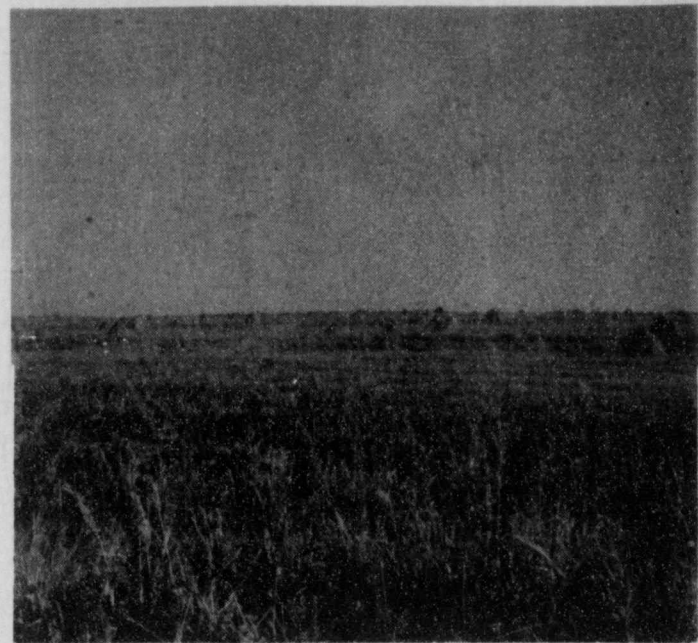
Diversion, standard and parallel terraces help to control erosion by holding up and spreading runoff water. This also eliminates a lot of silt and sediment from favorite fishing spots in lakes and streams.

Pastureland and rangeland in the Fisher County Area provide a large part of the cover and food needed by game birds and

animals. The control of invading brush, such as mesquite, and reseeding with adapted grasses improve conditions for livestock as well as for wildlife. Clearing brush in patterns and leaving trees and brush along streams and steep embankments provide travel lanes and protection for

game animals such as deer.

Conservation practices such as those mentioned above are used by farmers and ranchers in their day-to-day operations to improve and protect the soil. Where good soil and water conservation practices are carried out, a "field day" for outdoorsmen can be the result.

## Don't Cut Christmas Tree... Use Live One

Consider using a living Christmas tree this year. Since every one seems to be more ecology minded these days, what would be more fitting than a tree that could be used in the home for the holiday season and then moved to the yard or patio as a permanent fixture.

While the traditional Christmas tree is usually a conifer of some type, many broadleaved plants also make very attractive Christmas decorations, contends Everett Janne, landscape horticulturist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. The female Yaupon holly makes a very attractive Christmas tree with its bright red berries and small dark-green leaves. Regardless of the type of plant you select, be sure it is adapted for the area or is suited for interior landscaping.

For South Texas plants that may be used as living Christmas trees include the Podocarpus, Aleppo pine and Norfolk Island pine. Suggestions for Central Texas include the Deodar cedar, Arizona cypress, juniper, Podocarpus and Yaupon holly as well as many other holly varieties. If kept indoors, the Norfolk Island pine is very useful.

In North Texas the Colorado blue spruce, Scotch pine, Norway pine and a great variety of junipers make beautiful living Christmas trees, according to Janne. Some very interesting decorative effects can be achieved by using plants that are a little out of the ordinary in regard to shape rather than the typically conical shape usually associated with the Christmas tree.

Schedule your plans to the tree doesn't remain in the house more than two weeks, advises the horticulturist. Place it where it isn't in the air stream of a heater or air vent. A room temperature of 65 deg. at night will help keep the tree fresh.

Be sure to place the root ball or container in a leak-proof tub

A stocker calf Health Seminar will be held Wednesday, Dec. 15, at 2:00 p. m. at the City Auditorium in Seymour, according to Richard Spencer, County Agent. The Seminar is being sponsored by the Rollings Plains Economic Program Range and Livestock Committee and the Extension Service.

Two speakers are listed on the program. Dr. C. E. Deylde of Clarendon will speak on Prevention and Treatment of Diseases of Stocker Calves.

Pat Shepard, Feedlot Operator of Hale Center, will talk on "How to Make Pre-Conditioning Pay". A \$2.00 fee will be charged to pay travel expenses of the speakers.

This should be a very informative meeting, and anyone interested in stocker cattle should attend, according to Spencer.

Let's take a try at a few nice things to do in your kitchen and hunt up some special containers, attractive jars, cans, and boxes that make a "gift in a gift". Canning jars are fine for small cookies.

I have a beautiful divinity candy recipe that I want to share with you, and some "DATE BALLS".

**"DATE BALLS"**

1 cup Sugar  
3/4 cup Flour  
1/2 t. Salt  
1 cup Dates, chopped

1 cup walnut or pecan pieces  
2 well beaten eggs

(This is a recipe of LaNelle Boone, a gift giving mother)

Mix all dry ingredients first, add dates and nuts, beat eggs well and stir into mixture. Fold into oblong pyrex dish approx. 9x13 inches. Lined with foil and bake in 350 deg. oven until crusty (about 25 minutes). Let cool long enough to be able to work with hands, remove from pan and mix well into a big "glob". This part is a bit difficult, you just have to plunge in and mix. Pull off small quantities, roll into balls, and roll in powdered sugar.

**"DIVINITY"**

4 cups sugar  
2 cups hot water  
2 t. vinegar

2 large wooden spoonfuls of white Karo

Stir until ingredients are dissolved on high burner. This takes only a few minutes. Put lid on sauce pan and let come to a boil. Take lid off and continue to let boil, on high burner or flame, until a long thin string can be pulled off and will float. Beat 4 egg whites until foamy and slightly stiff. Add the hot mixture, slowly, beating at full speed. Continue to beat for quite a while until mixture stands up well. Just before stopping, add 3 t. vanilla and a dash of salt. Add four cups of chopped pecans (less if you must). Mix together then drop on waxed paper.

COUNTY AGENT NEWS

By Richard Spencer



Many ranchers throughout the Rolling Plains area run cow-calf type operations on native range land. Since there are no reported trace mineral deficiencies in our area of the state, a free choice bone-meal and salt supplement (phosphorus and salt) will generally take care of the mineral requirements.

Let's assume that our average operator properly stocks his range and that forage, either cured or green, is in adequate supply. This being the case, we can generally assume that the cows will consume enough forage to meet their energy requirements.

Vitamin A is usually in adequate supply on native ranges with the possible exception of years with a severely dry fall and winter. If this situation arises there are cheap sources of vitamin A available from injectable forms.

Protein supply is a different problem and varies tremendously from ranch to ranch. The warm season grasses such as buffalo grass, sidecoats grama, big and little bluestem and many others follow a definite pattern as to protein content. Digestible protein in these species starts off rather high in the spring (8-9%) drops to about 5% in mid-season, and by October falls to between one and two per cent.

We have seen what some of the forages can provide. The first reply might well be: so what? What does the cow need or require?

Nutritionally, the cow's requirements will vary with body size, calving date and the desired weaning weight of the calf. In order to calculate an example let us assume that the cow weighs 1000 lbs., that she will drop her calf on either Nov. or February 1, and that we want the calf to weigh 500 pounds at weaning.

The cow with the fall calf is under much greater stress with regard to forage supply than the cow that drops her calf in February. The availability of winter growing grasses determines, to a great extent, the type of supplemental feeding program that is required. Operators in wintergrass areas that desire to produce calves in the fall must be prepared to feed heavily in the dry years and possibly to a limited extent even in good years.

years. Much of the Rolling Plains is not blessed with an abundance of wintergrasses. In this case, the operator that produces fall calves should supplemental feed every year and during February and March even in good years. The estimates of forage quality are conservative in that cattle are selective grazers and their diets are generally of better quality than a general forage analysis would indicate.

The screwworm program has given the cow-calf operator the alternative of calving at anytime from early fall through the winter. Consequently the question is often asked: Is it best to have calves born in the fall or winter? There is no clear cut answer. Over the Rolling Plains as a whole, the ability of the forage to meet the cow's requirements is generally best suited to winter calving.

Feed costs (32% supplement at \$90 per ton) based on the protein requirements for a cow from Nov. 1-March 31, amount to \$19.11 in a dry year and \$7.24 in a wet year if the calf is born November 1. The cow calving February 1, would require little or no feed in the good years, and \$11.79 worth in the dry years.

Overall if all costs are considered, the economics are slightly in favor of the cow calving on February 1. In summary, a cow-calf operator needs to be very familiar with his forage resources and their nutritive value at the various seasons of the year. With that knowledge he can do an adequate job of supplementing his cow herd and keep feed costs at a minimum.
