Rotan City Council OK's Water Line West Of City

The Rotan City Council met March 14 for the regular monthly business session.

Among the items of business discussed was the designation of a new truck route for the National Gypsum Company. The gypsum company has been mining north of town until recently when they began mining operations on the Kennedy place east of Rotan.

The National Gypsum Co. and City Officials have re-routed the trucks to alleviate traffic from the school and hospital area. The new route to be taken by trucks will be down Lakeview, across Forrest, Sherman, Stonewall, and Sheridan Streets; turn west on Wheeler Street to Highway 70, down Highway 70 the Cotton Oil Mill then down the Gyp Mill Road.

The major portion of the roads the trucks will be traveling are unpaved. A joint effort between the City of Rotan, Fisher County and the Gyp Mill is underway to share in the cost of new and adequate road construction for the vehicles.

The Rotan councilmen also discussed the possibility of piping water to the new cemetery addition. No action was taken, however, it was felt that pop-

up sprinklers, cared for by city employees, would be used in the future.

The commissioners approved the construction of a new water line west of town to serve the families of Bruce Cox, John Cox, L. C. Hutchinson, Arnold Allen, B. F. Young, and Mrs. Lillie Underhill. The cost of the water line, including construction, is expected to be in the vicinity of \$3,000.00 and will be shared equally by the above named families.

The water line will be two-inch plastic pipe from the 10

inch main line from Snyder. There will be one-inch branch lines to the individual users. Construction is expected to be completed in April and will begin in the next few weeks.

The Rotan City Election will be held April 1, at the Rotan City Hall. Polls will be open from 8 a. m. to 7 p. m. for voting. In order to vote in the City Election, voters must have been registered at least 30 days prior to April 1st.
