

SCHOOL TRUSTEE ELECTION THIS SATURDAY

Fisher County voters will trek to polling places this Saturday to select those that will be responsible for establishing school policy on the four county independent school boards.

School trustee elections will be held at Rotan, Roby, Hobbs, and McCaulley on Saturday, April 1st, with all polling spots scheduled to open at 8:00 a.m. and remain open until 7 p.m.

Rotan voters will be selecting two out of three candidates on the school board ballot. Present incumbent, Dr. Jerry Marshall is seeking a another term on the board. He is the present secretary of the Rotan School Board. The two other candidates are Alan Houston and Alta Hinson.

Bernice Hargrove is the election judge. Voting will be in the Rotan Primary Building. Other members of the Rotan School Board are Bobby Gruben, Dick Edwards, Bobby Smith, Dwight Nowlin, Charlie Joe Helms.

Roby voters will have a choice of four people to fill two vacancies on the Roby Independent School Board. The two incumbents Kyle Moore and Archie Rivers are seeking re-election. The two others that have filed for school board slots are Howard Faight and W.C. Mat-

thies. The election judge is Glenna Jean Moore, who will be assisted by election clerks, Mary Beauchamp and Addie Markham.

Roby school board voters will be voting at the Fisher County Court House. Two Hobbs area people are running for two vacancies on the Hobbs Independent School Board. Sim Groves is seeking re-election. The only other person to file for duties was Jackie Ethredge. Former board member James Nettleton did not seek re-election.

Hobbs election judge is Sterling Willingham and voting is to be at the Hobbs School office.

The other members of the Hobbs School Board are Andrew

Williams, Harvie L. Davis, Jimmy Walker, Bishop Gordon and Howard Gordon.

McCaulley residents will be voting from five people to fill

four existing vacancies. Those on the ballot include E. T. Gipson, W. D. Cleveland, Billy W. Jeffrey, Roy Williams and Harvey Dowell.

Mrs. A. A. Smith is the election judge, assisted by Dalton Young, clerk. Voting will be in the McCaulley High School Cafeteria.

The other members of the McCaulley School Board are Cecil Williams, Dallas Acklin and W. T. McCright.

County voters will also be selecting members to the Fisher County School Board. Roy Neles is running as a candidate at-large. Roger Smith is running from Precinct #3, and Kermit

Terry from Precinct #4. Other members of the County School Board are L. W. Knox from Precinct #1 and Frank Kemp from Precinct #2.

Roby Takes Lion's Share At FFA Judging Contest

Roby FFA Range and Pasture Judging team placed first, led their school to the Schools Sweepstakes Trophy at the 24th annual Abilene Christian College judging contest, held Monday, March 27, in Abilene, that featured more than 700 students. With the assist of first, third, seventh and tenth place wins, Roby FFA took the Sweepstakes Trophy back to Fisher County.

Heading the Roby wins were the school's range and pasture judging team which won first place honors through the efforts of Mike Goodrum's high individual performance; Clyde Pursley's third high individual score and Ronald Pursley's fourth high score. The fourth member of the top range and pasture team, coached by Jim Laurie, is Ben Ramon, 19. The team had 734 points out of a possible 900, to outdistance the second place team by more than 30 points. Goodrum's score of 255 out of 300 possible points was followed by his number three and four teammates scores of 242 and 237 points.

Roby judging teams also had a tenth place win in the same contest and pegged third and seventh place wins in the land judging division with James Park placing ninth in the land contest with 207 points of a possible 280.

Members of the team are Ronald Pursley, Mike Goodrum, Clyde Pursley, Ben Ramon and James Park, coached by Jim Laurie.

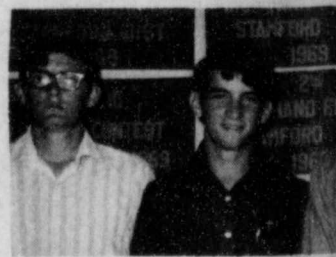

COUNTY AGENT NEWS

The alfalfa weevil was first found in northeast Texas in 1968. In 1970 this weevil was found in Wilbarger County. It is believed that the alfalfa weevil now is established in most of the alfalfa growing areas of the Rolling Plains area of Texas.

Larvae of alfalfa weevils cause heavy damage to alfalfa early in the spring, from the time the plants are 6 inches high until they reach the early bud stage. The larvae hatch from lemon-colored eggs which are laid in clusters of 2 to 25. Several hundred eggs are laid by each adult female weevil. The eggs may have been laid the previous fall or after overwintered weevils became active in the spring. Eggs hatch in one to two weeks in warm weather but eggs laid in the fall or early spring do not hatch until favorable temperatures are present.

Larvae are about 1/20 inch long and are cream colored when newly hatched. As they grow older they turn light green. Full grown larvae are about 1/4 inch long. Alfalfa weevils produce one generation each growing season, however, there may be a partial second generation. The alfalfa weevil larvae appear in the early spring and are most numerous from the time the plants are about 6 inches high until they reach the early flower bud stage. The larvae feed on alfalfa plants 3 to 4 weeks. When they have finished feeding the larvae spin cocoons about 1/4 inch long on the plants or within the curl of fallen dead leaves. They pupate within the cocoons and change to adults in 1 to 2 weeks.

The majority of the overwintered adults die by the time the first hay crop has been harvested. However they may survive to lay eggs in the second crop. Most of the young adults leave the alfalfa field and go to nearby protected areas soon after emergence. They become inactive or dormant during the summer. These alfalfa weevils return to alfalfa fields in the fall and mate at this time or during the following spring.

The first crop of alfalfa is damaged most severely by the larvae of the alfalfa weevil. Upon hatching, the larvae feed on the plant terminals and then on the lower foliage, skeletonizing the leaves. A heavily damaged alfalfa field appears grayish green at first. Damaged leaves dry rapidly and the field takes on a grayish whitish cast. In addition to destroying the first crop larvae may crawl to the new shoots of the second crop thus retarding the plant growth and reducing the second crop. Once a field becomes infested with weevils, damage usually occurs year after year. Recommended practices for alfalfa weevil control include following cultural practices that encourage a dense vigorous stand which reduces weevil damage. The first crop should be cut when most of the plants are in the bud stage with the cutting as clean and close as possible to deprive the larvae of food and shelter. Exposure of the larvae to the sun is usually fatal. If the populations are heavy, insecticidal control measures should be applied to the stubble just after harvest of the first cutting.

Insecticides can be effectively used to control the alfalfa weevil. Applications of insecticides should be applied when 50 to 75% of the alfalfas in the field show feeding damage. Ten to twenty larvae per square foot are considered to be an economic infestation. Producers should be inspecting their fields to determine what level of alfalfa weevil larvae infestation is present. If less than 50% of the terminals are infested with alfalfa weevil larvae, inspections of the fields should be made at weekly or bi-weekly intervals to determine if control measures will be necessary. Insecticide recommended for alfalfa weevil control include azinphosmethyl, carbaryl, diazinon, malathion, methoxychlor, methyl parathion, and parathion. Information concerning the use of these chemicals in control of the alfalfa weevil is presented in

TIPS By Alice K. Ballenger County Home Demonstration AGENT

Before you store the family's wool clothing, take some precautions to protect them from moths and other insects, advises Mrs. Alice Ballenger, county home demonstration agent.

Good woolens represent a considerable investment, so they should deserve the best of care during storage. Mrs. Ballenger offers these suggestions for keeping stored woolens moth-free:

Wash or dry-clean before storing to remove soil that might attract moths. Store in an airtight chest, trunk, or closet, not to be opened during summer. Clean closet or container and treat with a contact moth spray. Remove clothes from closet before spraying so walls can be treated thoroughly.

Use moth flakes, crystals or balls for additional protection. Follow directions on container for use. Or, use a moth stray on clothing.

Treat fabrics made of wool blended with another fiber as if they were all-wool. Unless they are absolutely clean, these blended fabrics are an appetizing dish to moths and carpet beetles, the home demonstration agent says.

Keeping garment hang tags can help simplify removal of spots on clothing.

"Most homemakers don't realize that garment or fabric type determines drycleaning methods," noted Mrs. Ballenger. Extension county home demonstration agent. "The cleaning equipment available should never be the main consideration."

Remember that the drycleaning fluid, perchlorethylene or perc, is not a new solvent. "Cleaning plants have relied on perc for more than 35 years. Most coin-operated machines now use it also," the agent explained.

Perc will damage only a few materials--furs, suede and vinyl. Fake furs will dry clean very well.

"You can safely clean expensive and delicate garments in coin-operated laundry and dry-cleaning stores, as well as in conventional plants. The type of material and accessories determines the cleaning process".

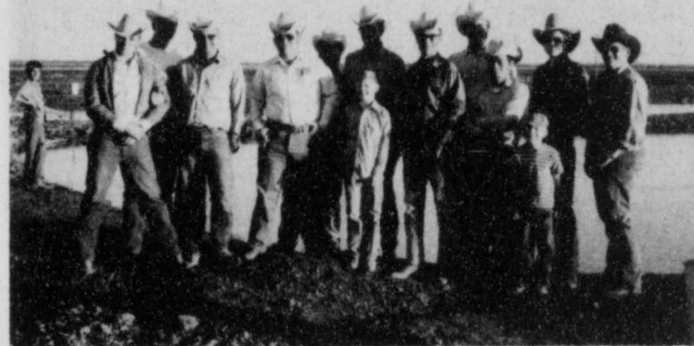
