In the distant future Fisher County residents will be faced with what could prove to be the most important decision they will ever be asked to make, when they vote for or against forming a


We pledged to keep our readers informed on important issues involving the progress of the hospital steering committee, and to date there have been no significant changes in the committee's plan. The next important step comes when the proposal is brought before the Legislature in Austin during the special session. If the members of the Texas House of Representatives and Senate approve the district as submitted, then it will be up to the residents of Fisher County to accept or reject the proposed hospital district. A special election will be called and each resident will be given the opportunity to vote after the district has received approval in Austin.

We attempted to emphasize in our editorial of May 11th that residents would have a vote and we re-emphasize that point today. We understand that there is a group circulating a petition in the east section of Fisher County that is informing potential signers that if the proposal passes the legislature, there will not be a vote by the people. This is absolutely untrue. There will never be a hospital district in Fisher County if the people don't vote to have one established.

We, in Fisher County, need to begin to realize that "the free ride is over", if we don't pay hospital district taxes for a hospital in Fisher County, we'll eventually pay them somewhere. Hamlin is beginning to move toward establishing a hospital district, and they would just love to take in the eastern portion of Fisher County. Sweetwater is not beyond creating a hospital district and swallowing up as much of Fisher County as they want. They have the vote in Sweetwater to do just about what they please.

If we are going to have to pay taxes in the future, why not pay them in Fisher County for a county hospital?







Parallel terraces helped to provide some Fisher County Farmers with more income from wheat in 1972.

One landowner who farms near Hamlin reported that wheat grown on some parallel terraced land made about five more bushels per acre than some he had planted across the fence on land that had regular terraces on it. The farmer attributed the increased production to the water holding and spreading ability of the parallel terraces.

Every increase in production

means more money in the farmer's pocket because he has about the same production costs whether he produces a little or

According to Gerald Harmon, Soil Conservationist, Rotan, now is the time to construct parallel terraces on wheat land before planting time arrives this fall. Cost-share assistance for building parallel terraces may be obtained by making application for such work at the County ASCS
