

PROPOSED HOSPITAL SITE BETWEEN ROBY-ROTAN

An air of action and dedicated cooperation dominated the recent meeting of the Hospital Steering Committee when it held an informal briefing session with Eugene Vineyard, representing the consulting firm of Vineyard and Street in Austin.

Those attending the session included: Melton Field, Ralph Ammons, Allan Houston, Kermit Terry, Foy Mithcell, Mr. Vineyard, Wayne Harris, Dr. C. M. Callan, Cecil King, Raleigh Springer, and R. D. Terry. Vineyard pointed out that the steering committee had

complied with all rules and did meet the deadline to apply for Hill-Burton grants. If the proposed district is approved for a grant, it could amount to as much as 50% of the eligible cost of construction.

Vineyard informed those in attendance that the estimated cost of the proposed 30 bed hospital would run approximately \$1,430,000 and of that figure the highest Hill-Burton grant would be \$611,525.00.

Assuming that the full grant is approved, the county taxpayers would have to underwrite approximately \$818,475 in the form of bonds for the hospital construction.

Vineyard remarked that it would be early in 1973 (February or March) before any official word is received on the Hill-Burton grant.

Wayne Harris remarked that the probable construction site of the new hospital would be between Roby and Rotan and close enough to tie into city water and sewerage. The site would have to be approved by the Texas State Health Department.

The committee also discussed the possibility of the district not being approved during the 1973 Texas Legislature. The suggestion was made that an alternate plan would be to build the hospital in the name of Fisher County, and let the county collect the taxes county wide for the proportionate share of construction.

The committee was fully aware of the limited opposition on the hospital district and the item brought up by one board member of the likely hood of some of the outlying portion of the county being taxed for two hospitals. The mention was made of the area to the west of Hamlin, if Hamlin votes in a hospital district and takes in the Round Top area, people residing in Fisher County that

live in that area would be paying taxes for a Hamlin Hospital. If Fisher County were to construct a county hospital, they would also be paying for a Fisher County Hospital. This same example is true with the residents in the south part of Fisher County.

Sweetwater could vote in a hospital district and annex a portion of the southern end of Fisher County. Those residents would pay taxes to the Sweetwater Hospital and also to the Fisher County hospital. The above situations involving the possibility of a double tax is based on the assumption that the Fisher County Hospital District is not approved in Austin and the secondary plan of Fisher County building a hospital comes about. If the Texas Legislature passes their approval on the district then no other district could tax Fisher County residents.

Dr. C. M. Callan assured those present that the Callan Hospital would remain open being forced to close its door.

Ralph Ammons made the remark that "we (the steering committee) must not take a defeatist attitude". He remarked that the committee must explore every possibility and decide to build a hospital, if that is what the people want, and vote to do, regardless.

Rotan, Roby Contemplate Joint Waste Disposal Site

Members of the Rotan City Council met with Roby Mayor Cecil King and Roby City Manager J. B. Hughey at the Rotan City Council meeting to discuss some problems Roby is having concerning the solid waste disposal at the city dump.

King informed the members present for the council meeting that he was interested in attempting to "work something out to use your facilities" King was referring to the acreage north of Roby that is being used for a dump.

City Manager Kenneth Vann informed those in attendance that the last 12 month cost for the dump ground was \$4,256.00. That figure included labor, upkeep, dozier repair, gas and oil. He then subtracted \$650.00 for depreciation on the present dozier to get the figure of \$3,606.43 that represents the 12 month actual cost of operation.

Mayor King asked Mayor Wendell Morrow for an estimated cost to the city of Roby for the use of Rotan's facilities, Morrow roughly estimated the cost of 25% of that now being paid by Rotan.

The mayors of Rotan and Roby also openly discussed the possibility of approaching the Fisher County Commissioners in hopes that they could assist in solving the land fill solid waste disposal problem.

Councilman Lester Sessell

seemed optimistic that a plan could be worked out that would be fair to all concerned.

Mayor Morrow remarked that "the time is here for all small towns to work together on items such as this one, and others."

Councilman Jay Hendon made a motion to secure bids on seal coating 46 city blocks in the near future. The motion was seconded by Jack Jones. City Manager Vann recommended that the council consider using the same seal coat (AC-5) a composition of asphalt and featherlite gravel as was used in

seal coating the streets in 1970. The council placed under study a discussion headed by

Jesse Hudnall Promoted To Marine Sgt.

A graduate of Rotan High School, and a 1969 graduate of West Texas State University in Canyon, he joined the Marine Corps in March 1970.

City Manager Vann to consider modernizing the garbage collection procedures in Rotan. He indicated that more and more cities were going to the system of using several 3 or 6 yard garbage containers per block. This system has several immediate advantages but has a high initial cost. These were to be studied before the August meeting.

Other items discussed included notification to the City of Rotan of a sales tax suit, the construction of new garbage racks at the city park and the need for a new fairway mower at the golf course.

Jay Hendon and Lester Sessell made and seconded a motion respectively to instruct the Tax Equalization Board to follow the same procedures on tax hearings that will be coming up in the future.

The last item centered around

a standing policy that the City has in regard to city purchasing. All councilmen seemed in agreement that the city of Rotan will continue patronizing local firms that pay their taxes when purchasing goods and services for the city.

County Oil Valuation Is Up Approximately \$300,000

A special meeting of the Fisher County Commissioner's Court was held last Tuesday morning for the purpose of giving oil companies that have interests in Fisher County, and Pritchett and Abbott, Oil Valuation Assessors the opportunity to discuss oil rate and valuation changes.

As a result of the oilboard of equalization, there will be no changes in the rate or valuation, Fisher County Auditor, Al Finch, indicated that according to the latest revised estimate on

the oil valuation there will be an estimated increase in valuation of \$300,000. The early estimate from Pritchett & Ab-

bott indicated that the valuation would be approximately \$23 million. The last estimate is \$23,300,000.

Roby City Hall Former Chevrolet Dealership

The City Hall in Roby, Texas has an interesting history all its own. Originally built by Charles Hogsett, it housed a Chevrolet business for a number of years. In January of 1960 the city purchased the building for the purpose of converting it into a City Hall.

Quoting City Secretary, Virginia Melton, "In January, 1960, with very little in the way of improvements, we just moved in. A new coat of paint on the once painted concrete floor covered the renovation made

at that time."

In noting changes made in the interior arrangement, Mrs. Melton recalls that the front section, now consisting of entry and attractive countered outer office, was all one room; and the office at the right, now partitioned for an office and storage space, was then occupied by Mr. J. B. Hughey.

Plans for remodeling the City Hall were developed in 1970 by the City Commissioners and Mayor Harris Davis. After the death of Mr. Davis in November

of that year, Mayor Cecil J. King and Commissioners Jimmy C. Price and Jimmy Hayes carried out the plans for renovation and remodeling the building. The results may be stated in two words--attractive and functional.

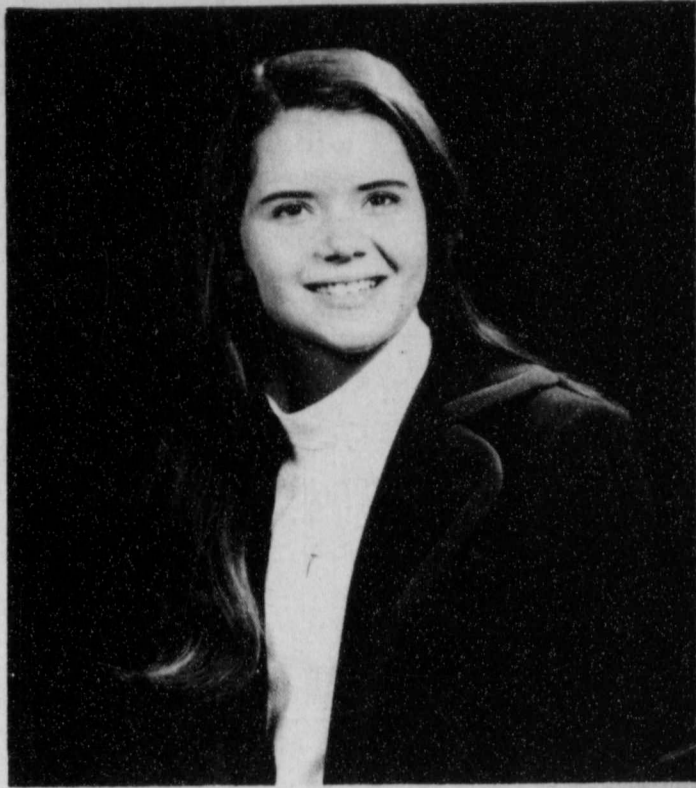
Krenek Named To Western Texas Post

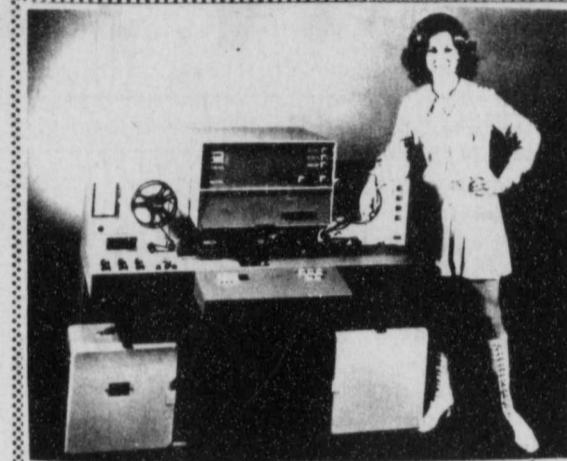

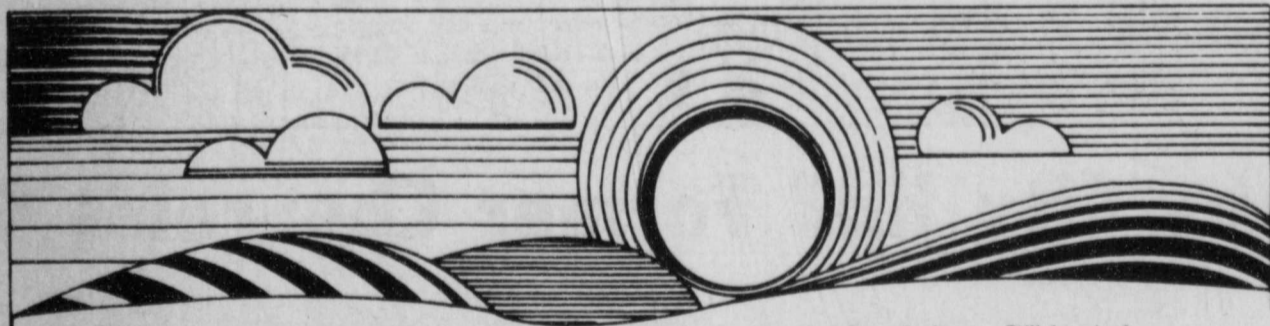

Such proposals will at said time be publicly opened, read aloud and referred to the County Judge for consideration, with the final award of contract proposed to be made on the 11th day of September, 1972, by the Commissioners' Court convened at its regular meeting place at the County Courthouse.

Plans, specifications and contract documents may be examined without charge at the office of the County Clerk, Fisher County Courthouse, Roby, Texas. Two sets of plans and specifications may be obtained by bona fide prime bidders, upon deposit of \$25.00 for each set, at the Office of Lovett Sellers & Associates, Architects, 618 South Abe, San Angelo, Texas 76901. All deposits will be refunded upon returning plans and specifications promptly and in good condition. Additional plans and specifications may be obtained upon payment of the cost of reproduction. No sets or partial sets will be issued to sub-bidders or material suppliers.

Plans and specifications will be placed in appropriate Plan Rooms throughout the state for the use of sub-contractors and material suppliers.

A CERTIFIED OR CASHIER'S CHECK issued by a bank satisfactory to the Commissioners' Court, payable to the order of the County Judge, Fisher County, Texas, or an acceptable bid bond given by a reliable surety company authorized to do business in the State of Texas, shall be submitted by each bidder, in an amount not less than five percent (5%) of the total bid as a guarantee that if awarded the contract, the bidder will promptly enter into a contract with the County and execute such bonds as are required. V.A.T.C.S. ATTENTION is directed to Article 5159a, V.A.T.C.S., which requires that not less than the general prevailing rates of per diem wages for work of a similar character in the locality where the work is performed shall be paid all laborers, workmen and mechanics employed in the construction of public works.

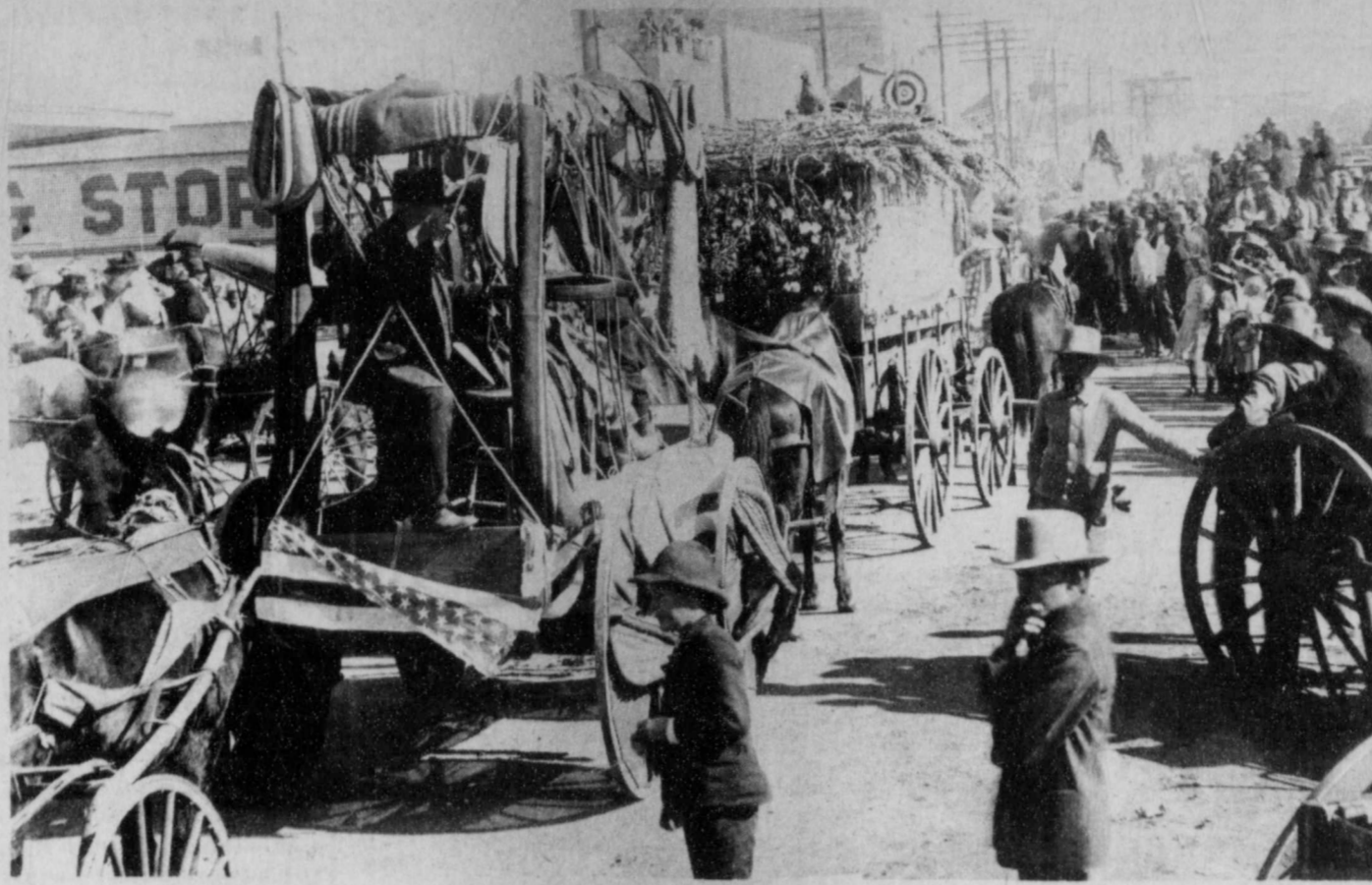

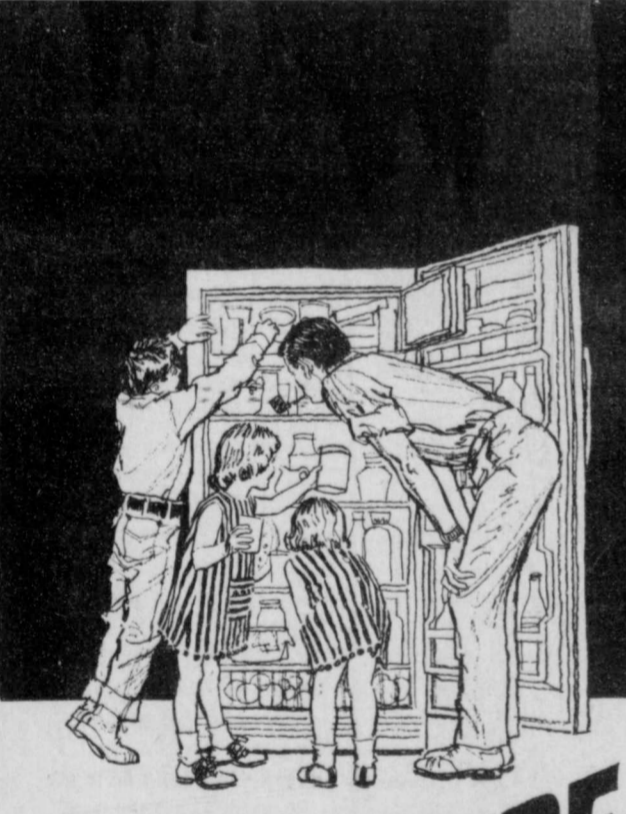

Senior team. According to Bobby Yates, manager of the team, they will be playing some semipro. As soon as the dates are available they will be listed in the paper.

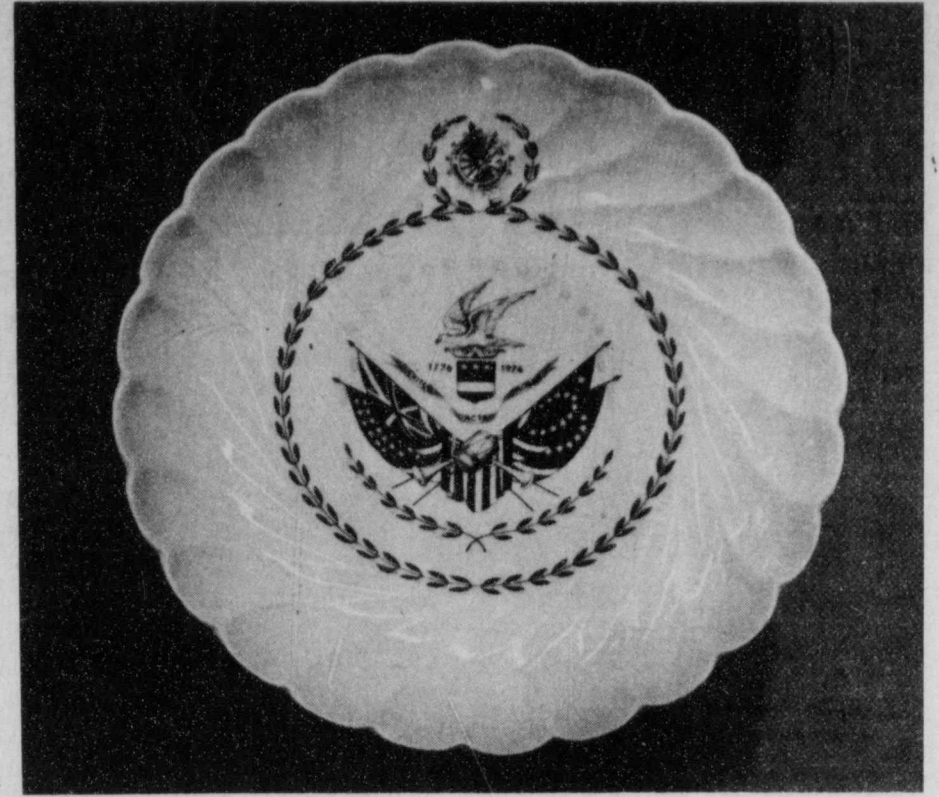

1976 DAR Dish Depicts Symbols

National Society, Daughters of the American Revolution, has commissioned Haviland and Co. to make bonbon dishes commemorative of the Society's bicentennial observance in 1976.

Mrs. Bernie McCrea, Abilene, associate member of Rotan's new DAR chapter, Anne Pettus Shelburne, brought back several of the dishes for gifts from the DAR Continental Congress she attended in Washington, D. C. in April.

"Mr. Haviland was there to autograph these dishes for us,"

Mrs. McCrea said, "I was most fortunate in having a nice visit with him, and he gave the story of his company's china."

The dish was designed for the DAR by Loratta Hurns Jones, a young American artist. Mrs. Jones drew upon symbols of the American Revolution and its leaders, and the arrangement of banners, drums and bugles is based on a painting by Trumbull, circa 1786-96.

Eagle, shield and motto were taken from George Washington's private bookplate. Flags in the

design are the Bennington Flag of 1776, our present standard and Grand Union Ensign.

Four generations of the Haviland family have manufactured Limoges china. The original factories were founded and expanded by a young American, David Haviland, in the mid 19th century.

The bonbon dishes were made in the company's French factory.
