DRINK A LITTLE WINE FOR THY STOMACH'S SAKE

"Drink no longer water, but use a little wine for thy stomach's ke and thine often infirmities" (I Timothy 5:23).

Through the years many have gone to this passage seeking the approval of social and moderate use of alcoholic beverages. Paul's instruction to "use a little wine" is heralded as proof that it is all right to "drink a little" just as long as "you don't overdo it." We have never known a man who sought above all else to please God to resort to such misuse of this passage.

A proper translation of this passage is found in the New American Standard Bible: "No longer drink water exclusively, but use a little wine for the sake of your stomach and your frequent ailments." (Note also the Revised Standard Version on this passage). Now let us make some observations concerning this passage. 1. Timothy was a total abstainer- "Drink no longer water ex-

2. The wine was to be drunken for his "stomach's sake"and not for the sake of "pleasure or excitement' not for "social ac-

3. Timothy had infirmities and no doubt knew that wine would have alleviated his condition, but even then would not even use it as a medicine until Paul urged him to do so to pre-

4. Paul apparently knew and approved of Timothy's habit of total abstinence and asked him to depart from it only to the extent necessary to preserve his health.

5. The passage does not teach that the "water was bad" (or unfit for consumption), but that Timothy's "stomachwas bad" and needed treatment.

6. It is by no means certain that the wine suggested was of an intoxicating variety. Pliny spoke of several wines approved for medicinal purposes which contained little or no alcohol-

7. Social drinking or drinking for pleasure is not contemplated in this passage and cannot find approval here.

Instead of justifying the use of wine (or beer or any other aloholic drink) as a beverage, this passage does just the opposite. reveals to us a young man brought up under the influence of godly mother and grandmother (2 Tim. 1:5; 3:14-15), trained in the knowledge of the Old Testament Scriptures and who, being converted to Christ is now a model Christian. While living in an age of wine drinking, and being familiar with its dangers as well as the warnings given in the Scriptures regarding it, Timohy was careful also "not to eat flesh, nor to drink wine, nor to do anything whereby thy brother stumbleth" (Rom. 14:21). Thus it is only by the urging of the apostle Paul that he will even

Beloved, that passage gives us an insight into the life of a man who is whole-heartedly interested in pleasing God and being a real Christian, and who is concerned about the welfare of others. Church of Christ, Roby



PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that after due publication hereof, the undersigned intent to apply to the Texas Legislature at its regular session of the 63rd Legislature in 1973 for the passage of an Act authorizing the creation of a Hospital District over all of Fisher County, Texas, under the authority granted by Article IX, Section 9 of the Texas Constitution, the general purposes and nature of such Act being expressed as follows:


