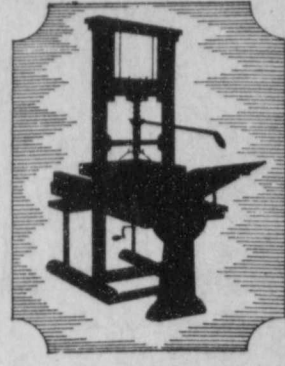
### Halloween Carnival Will Be Held In Roby, Oct 31

### Lions Shocked By High Flying Bronte Longhorn

Bronte fullback Kim Barrett scored four touchdowns to lead the Longhorns to a 38-20 win over the Roby Lions Friday night at Bronte in a Class 3-B game.

Barrett got his third TD for the Longhorns on a 37 yard run in the third period. The PAT try failed.

Barrett's third TD came in the fourth period on a 44 yard run and he kicked the PAT, as he did moments later after a 2 yard score.

Roby came back with Evers passing to Castro for a 35 yard Roby touchdown, but the PAT failed.

Roby's Donnie Stephens, a back, closed out scoring for the night with a 2 yard run, followed by his run for 2 extra points.

Bronte is now 6-1 for the season and 3-0 in district, while Roby dropped its second game of the season and first in district to show a 4-2-1 and 2-1 record.

Bronte got 12 points in the first quarter on Allan Barbee's two yard run and Barrett's first TD of the night, a two-yarder. Both PAT tries failed.

Roby got its first quarter score on a six yard pass from Dale Evers to Frank Castor. The extra point try failed.

In the second quarter, Barbee scored again for Bronte on a 12 yard run, then he added the extra point.

### H. GOVAN IN 50TH YEAR AS TOP YELLOWHAMMER

Reminiscing about the past for Rotan's H. Govan just naturally leads to football. H has been a Rotan resident for fifty-three years and he recalls the first football team that was organized here fifty years ago.

The very first game was with Aspermont, and we won by a score of 6-0. The football field was where the post office is now. That was near Mr. Smart's and he had bee hives. Sometimes when the boys were playing they would chase after the ball and run into the hives and get stung.

Montgomery and Kelly Holder. Many of them are not living now.

"Calling signals was a lot different then, I remember that when Connor would want Kelly to carry the ball, he'd say, 'Get down in the line, Kelly' for the signal.

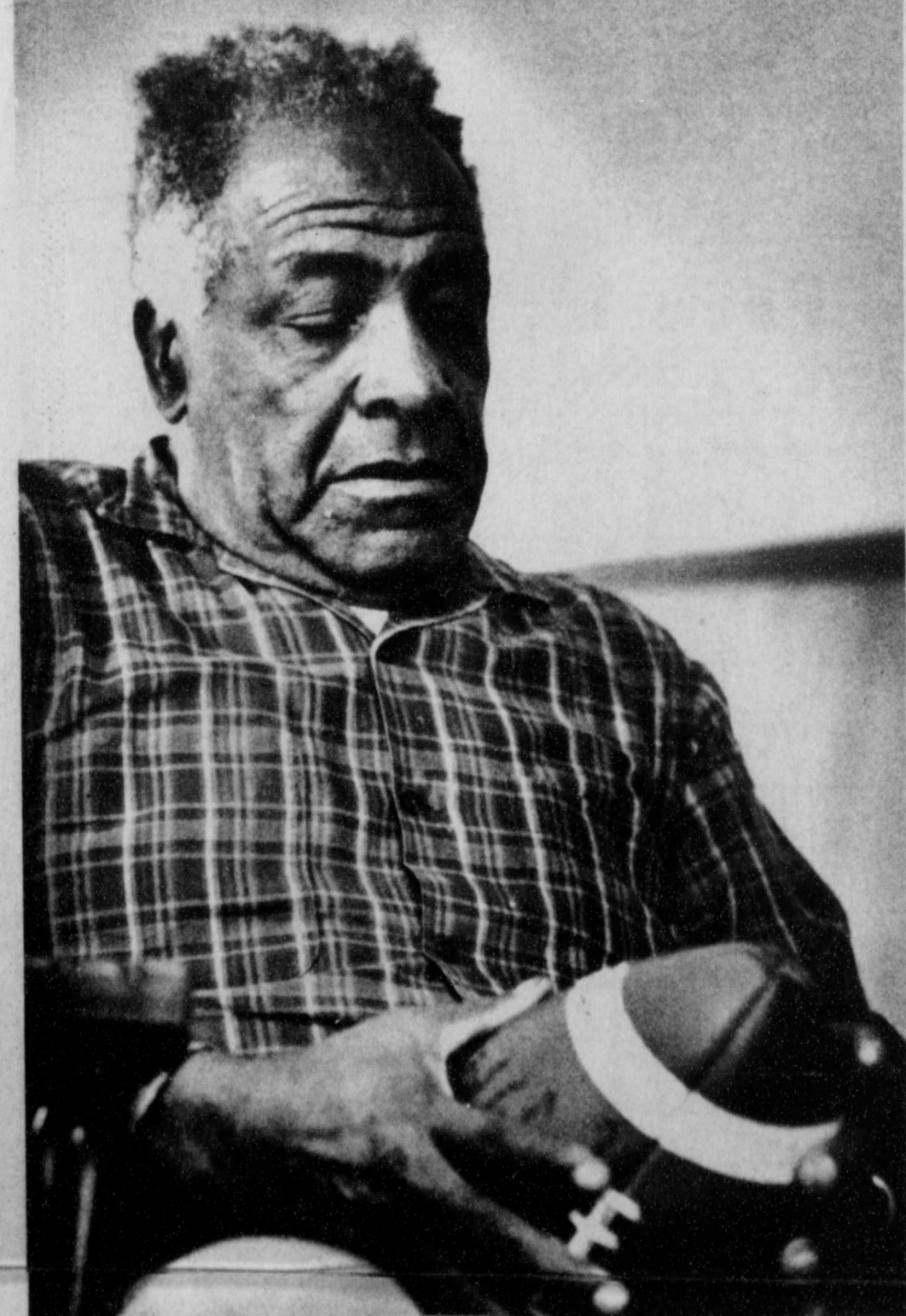
"We didn't have a bus to take the boys to the out of town games. They would borrow cars and get the parents to take them. Another difference, there was no age limit—they could play until they were forty years old!"

H. Govan recalls, "The first football team in Rotan was coached by Horace Oliver. That was in 1923—fifty years ago,

"I can't recall the names of all the boys who played on that first team, Connor Robinson was quarterback. Some of the others were Jake Fields, Ross Burnes, Ben Hargrove, Roy Hargrove, Hue

"In 1933 Rotan won our District with Coach Jobe. He only had twelve boys playing at that time. I don't recall all of them, I remember that Curtis Acker, Flaps Berry, O. B. Cave, and Wilburn Porter were on that team. We played Lamessa for Bi-District and lost.

"Of course the biggest thrill was when we won the State Championship in 1962. We won over Ingleside by a score of 39-6. Coach Tommy Watkins was here then. But there have been lots of good years. One of his prize possessions is the football used in the Championship game, autographed by each player on the team.

"Horace Oliver coached the team just one year. The following year, 1924-1925, J. C. Tittle came to Rotan as coach. He stayed for several years and we had good teams. The name 'YELLOWHAMMERS' was chosen in 1924.

"We've had good coaches in Rotan, I remember Coach Jobe who followed Tittle. He was from Stephenville and was right fresh out of college. He'd say 'Boys, I don't know what you did over the week-end, but whatever it was, we must work it out of you so that we'll be ready to win that game Friday night'. He didn't have any assistants—he did it all by himself. He would also mow the football field and anything else that needed to be done.

Mr. Govan remembers that Rotan once had an American Legion football team made up of all Vets. He refers to that as the years when we had "double-header" teams. One played in the morning and the other in the afternoon. H worked with both teams. He says, "For about four years we would play Stamford on November 11th. We'd take a special train there for the games".

H. has a copy of the 1927-28 Annual, El Eco, that was given to him by Robert R. Patterson. The 1927 season was a good one for the Yellowhammers. With the exception of two games with College Subs, they won every game and were only scored against once for 6 points. The district record in finishing the football season is a masterpiece in itself. It begins, "When Coach Tittle issued a call for football

The Rotan Yellowhammers, looking less than impressive on pass defense, managed a 26-14 win over the Wylie Bulldogs to up their district record to 2-1.
