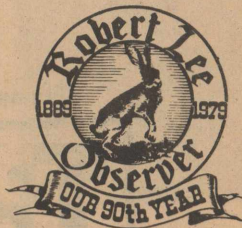

## Pamphlet Tells About Tax Laws

A new 12-page pamphlet is available in City Hall for taxpayers in Robert Lee. This pamphlet explains how the property tax system in Texas operates, and highlights possible tax savings available to citizens. The publication was developed by the State Property Tax Board in accordance with Senate Bill 621, passed by the Texas Legislature in 1979. Information in the pamphlet is applicable to property taxes collected by all levels of local government, including counties, cities, and school districts.

Disabled veterans who are eligible for exemptions must come in and apply for this exemption, and present a letter confirming the disability.

April 30 is the rendition deadline for the City of Robert Lee and citizens are urged to render their property and apply for exemptions for which they qualify before that date.

Absentee voting in the primary elections which are set for May 3 is not going at to fast a pace, according to County Clerk Mrs. Winnie Waldrop. A check with her office at 4 p.m. Tuesday indicated that 14 persons had voted absentee in the Democratic Primary and one in the Republican Primary.
