GOLD IN MISSOURI STREAM

Oregon Placer Miner Discovers Quantities of the Precious Mineral in Perry Fork Creek.

St. Louis, Mo.—Specimens of grain gold have been placed in the hands of the secretary of the recent United States geological exhibit at the fair, and also sent to the professor of geology at the University of Missouri, by G. D. Elgin, a placer miner of Oregon, who says he found the metal in Missouri.

Eight made this discovery last October in the Perry Fork creek, which divides Howard and Boone counties, near Columbia, while on a visit to his brother-in-law, R. B. Alexandria, Alexandria owns the farm through which the stream runs at this particular point.

The officers of the University of Missouri have promised to examine this locality at the first opportunity to try to determine how much gold is really there.
