CAME ONE DAY TOO LATE.

Bellef in St. Petersburg That the Czar's Receipt is But Cry of Despair.

St. Petersburg, March 6.—The history of Friday's imperial receipt sheds a curious illuminating light upon the struggles for ascendancy between the forces of reaction and liberalism which are raging about the emperor, again compelling one to draw a parallel with the French revolution and impressing the truth of Prince Bismarck's famous remark that everything King Louis XVI. did to preserve his throne came a day too late.

Substantially, the decision to permit representatives of the people to participate in a consultative capacity in consideration of projected reforms and preparation of laws had been taken by the emperor three months ago on the advice of the Prince Sviatopolk-Mirsky and had been actually incorporated in clause 3 of the December manifesto.

Notwithstanding the paens of praise with which some of the Russian papers greet the document, hailing it with such expressions as "The dawn of a new era for the Slav race;" "The Rubicon of mistrust has been crossed;" "The moment for which we have been thirsting with trembling, longing and tortured souls has arrived;" and "The voice of the people at last will be heard in the councils of the empire," there is the greatest diversity of views as to what is actually intended; but by the evident design all translate the imperial receipt as a promise of a real legislative chamber, upon which they intend to make the fight.

The disorders which were predicted Sunday and at Moscow for Saturday and Sunday did not occur, although the strike situation here appears distinctly more threatening. The authorities profess great hope that the receipt will completely change the attitude of the vast bulk of the workmen, who really are only demanding economic reforms by a strike, but who are easy victims to a propaganda of their revolutionary comrades.

St. Petersburg, March 6.—An imperial receipt announces the retirement of M. Tchertkov and the appointment of M. Maximovich as governor-general of Warsaw.

REWARD FOR EAGLE HEADS.

A price has been put on the head of the American eagle in Tehama county, California. The board of supervisors offers a reward of one dollar for the head of each of the great birds on the petition of the sheep men, who have lost many lambs by eagles.

TWO KILLED IN TRAIN WRECK.

St. Paul, Minn., March 6.—General Manager H. J. Horn, of the Northern Pacific, received information that passenger train No. 81 which left St. Paul Friday night for the Pacific coast, was in a head-on collision with a freight near Bearmouth, Mont., and that two persons were killed and two injured.

MORGAN PRODUCED CASH.
 Member of the Colorado Legislature Says \$1,500 Was Offered Him to Vote for Adams.

Denver, Col., March 7.—Senator R. W. Morgan (Republican) of Boulder county, announced at opening of the joint convention of the general assembly that \$1,500 had been offered him and \$750 had already been given him for his vote for Governor Alva Adams in the contest for the office of governor.

James M. Herbert, whom Senator Morgan charged with having given him \$750 as a bribe, is vice president and general manager of the Colorado & Southern railroad and stands in the foremost ranks of railroad officials in the United States. Daniel Sullivan, who is accused by the senator of having offered the alleged bribe, is postmaster of Cripple Creek and one of the most prominent republican workers in this state. Eight informations charging bribery and conspiracy were filed against Messrs Herbert and Sullivan in the criminal court by District Attorney George M. Stidger, almost simultaneously with the springing of the sensation in the joint convention by Senator Morgan. "I do not believe the charges," Gov. Adams said in reply to a question, "and I believe that they are made simply as part of the political game. Senator Morgan came in to see me of his own accord on March 2, the day on which he says a bribe was offered him, and he volunteered the information that he would vote for me. I thanked him for his vote and he said that he was convinced that he was honestly elected and entitled to the vote."

Mayor Wells Renominated. St. Louis, March 7.—The complete returns in the democratic primaries show that Mayor Wells and the ticket were supported by 25,000 voters.
