**AGAIN A HEATHEN.**

Daniel Wilberforce, Missionary in Africa, Is Devil Worshiper.

**WAS EDUCATED IN UNITED STATES.**

For 25 Years the Negro Was Faithful to the Christian Teachings But at Last Was Lured to the Old Life.

Huntington, Ind., March 10.—The executive committee of the missionary board of the United Brethren church a native African, who was brought to this country as a child and after being educated was returned by the board to his old tribe as a missionary. It is charged by the board that after a service of 25 years as a missionary the negro minister has been lured back to heathenism, has become chief of his old tribe of devil-worshippers and has contracted plural marriages in the wilds of Africa.

Nearly 50 years ago Dr. Daniel Kummer Flickinger, then secretary of the missionary board of the church, was in west Africa on mission work. While visiting a Congregational missionary announcement was made that a male child had been born in the negro village. The host of Dr. Flickinger christened the baby Daniel Flickinger Wilberforce. Twelve years later the boy had been brought to America by a returning missionary and Dr. Flickinger accidentally discovered him at work at the missionary house in New York. He took the lad to Dayton, O. and he was sent to school, then through high school, and later to a medical college at Cleveland. He married a negro at Dayton and the two went to Africa to do missionary work among the old tribe from which Wilberforce came. Later the family returned to the country and Wilberforce lectured throughout the central states. His four children, two sons and two daughters, attended college here. Two sons are still in this country, one at Otterbein college and the other in the Dayton high schools. Wilberforce returned to Africa and the board has been informed of his return to heathenism and its accompanying plural marriages together with his becoming chief of the tribe. The venerable Dr. Flickinger is much depressed over the backsliding of his protegee but sanctioned the action of the board.

**ASK COURT FOR OPINION.**

Gubernatorial Contest in Colorado "In the Air" Until Republicans Get a New Foothold.

Denver, Colo., March 10.—The joint legislative convention has sought an opinion from the state supreme court on the question whether it has the power to declare the office of governor vacant and what the effect of such action would be and the decision of the Peabody-Adams gubernatorial contest will be deferred until the court's answer is received.

Senator Morton Alexander, a member of the contest committee, was allowed to amend his report, which favored the seating of Lieut. Gov. Jesse A. McDonald as governor, in such a way that if it be now adopted by the joint convention Gov. Adams will be legislated out of office.

Alexander's amended report declares that there was no legal election for the office of governor held in the state last November, but the resolution declaring Lieut. Gov. McDonald "the legal, duly qualified governor of the state" is omitted and the following is substituted: "Resolved, That the action of the joint assembly in declaring Alva Adams elected governor be hereby rescinded and revoked and that a vacancy be declared in the office of governor." Under the constitution the adoption of the Alexander resolution would seem to have the effect of continuing Former Gov. James H. Peabody in office, his legal successor having not been elected. That question, however, will be submitted to the supreme court for adjudication before a vote is taken.

**Tenants Arrested Far from Home.**

Emporia, Kan., March 10.—The Emporia police arrested James Clark Nicoll here, who is 17 years of age and is wanted for running away from his home at Council Bluffs, Ia., to keep from attending school. He was accompanied by Art S. Langstrom, who went to jail rather than leave his comrade.

**PLAGUE ALARMS INDIA.**

In Burmah and Other Afflicted Places Whole Sections of Towns Are Being Burned.

Calcutta, India, March 10.—The plague recently spread to Burmah, where it is making rapid strides. This season of the year always favors its extension. The government is making every effort to eradicate it, de-

stroying by burning whole sections of towns, and segregating the inhabitants. But owing to the climate and the sanitary condition of the outlying districts and native sections of the towns it is difficult to cope with the epidemic which breaks out continually at fresh points. The deaths are said to be 90 per cent. of those infected. As a result of the plague the labor supply for the manufacturing centers has seriously depreciated. So long as the plague

existed in India that the native population regard it callously. Statistics show that the deaths from bubonic plague in India within a few years reached nearly 3,000,000. In 1903 the mortality in India from the plague alone was 850,000.
