ENDS SIXTY-DAY SESSION.

Kansas Legislature Passed 543 Bills and Submitted Three Constitutional Amendments.

Topeka, Kan., March 11.—The Kansas legislature adjourned sine die, after a session of exactly 60 days. The work of the legislature has been done since Tuesday night, but the session had to be kept open in order to receive messages from the governor and give the enrolling committee time to perform their work.

The legislature passed 543 bills, or two less than were passed two years ago. It submitted three constitutional amendments. One to provide for probate judges pro tempore, one to repeal double liability, and one to prohibit special legislation. The last named, if the people accept it, will cut out the biennial practice of taking valuable property out of city tax rolls without notice to the people and stop either grants by special legislation. The double liability amendment is designed to make the constitution consistent with the supreme court. In 1901 the legislature repealed the statute on the subject. Afterward the supreme court held the constitutional provision not to be self-enforcing and so now the people are asked to vote it out of the constitution entirely. The probate judge amendment is unimportant either way.

Helpless Cripple from Hazing.

San Francisco, March 11.—A helpless cripple from hazing young Albert Judge Morgan's court on crutches and Judge Morgan's court on crutches and swore out warrants for the arrest of the Hopkins art students who made him a victim of their sport. Judge Morgan issued the warrants for the arrest of the ringleaders in the hazing. They are Jackson Hatch, Jr., A. F. Hunt and Curran C. Harrison, all students at the Hopkins Art Institute, where young De Rome, a fellow student, was hazed on November 18, last.

Kansas Has Offended Roosevelt.

Washington, March 11.—It is perhaps as well that the Kansas house of representatives did not adopt the senate resolution censuring Commissioner Garfield. The president, it is said, has shown more feeling over this resolution than the commissioner of corporations. He regarded the resolution as an act of presumption which would prejudice the people in advance in the Standard Oil investigation.

Gov. Folk Signs Repeal Bill.

Jefferson City, Mo., March 11.—Gov. Folk has signed the breeders' law repeal bill. This measure kills the existing statute prohibiting bookmaking and pool selling, except in certain enclosures. There is at present no specific law against bookmaking or pool selling in the state, and unless the new bill which has been passed by the house is passed by the senate the several communities will be forced to prosecute betting on horse races under the general gambling laws.

Good Men to Hold On.

Washington, March 11.—A general policy as to federal appointments was determined upon by the president and his cabinet yesterday. For the present, at least, the uniform policy will be to retain incumbents in office during satisfactory service. This policy will hold, it is stated further, entirely irrespective of the length of service of the incumbent.

Premium for Philippine Bonds.

Washington, March 11.—The Mercantile Trust company, of St. Louis, was the highest bidder yesterday for the \$2,500,000 issue of 10-30 four per cent Philippine public works bonds. The bid of the Mercantile Trust company for the entire issue was \$2,726,500 or at the rate of 109.06.

No Threat Against India.

St. Petersburg, March 11.—The Associated press is assured from an official source that the despatch of Russian troops and guns to the Afghan border constituted absolutely no threat against India.

Last Day of Chadwick Trial.

Cleveland, O., March 11.—Today will see the close of the present trial of Mrs. Chadwick, and the case will probably be given to the jury during the afternoon.

Accused of Killing Wife.

Tawhuska, Ok., March 11.—L. L. Denoy, a prominent cattleman and member of the Osage tribe, was arrested here, charged with having killed his wife.

SHOT MAN WHO OWED HIM.

Tragedy at Wichita Over Failure of the Casey Wholesale Mercantile Company.

Wichita, Kan., March 11.—J. C. Casey, head of the Casey Wholesale Mercantile company, was shot through the head and instantly killed by James Oliver. Oliver lost \$32,000 in the failure of the Casey Wholesale Mercantile company two days ago and the

misfortune preyed on his mind. He demanded his money when the firm was reorganized and had several heated arguments with Casey over the loss. Yesterday when Casey returned from lunch Oliver was in Casey's office. After Casey sat down at his desk Oliver slipped up behind him and fired three times without warning. Death ensued instantly. Oliver walked to police headquarters and gave himself up. Casey was prominent in church circles and society.

Good Place For Mr. Parker.

Topeka, Kan., March 11.—The governor has appointed John B. Baker, a citizen of Peabody, Marion county, to be live stock sanitary commissioner. He takes the place of the old live stock sanitary commission of three members, which was abolished this winter and one commissioner substituted. The commission must keep its office in Topeka. The bill creating the office carries a salary appropriation of \$3,500 a year and \$500 for traveling
