ment. The best plan I think is to permit the Indians to acquire titles to land in other parts of the states near the reservation and make homes for themselves and families. They are industrious and willing to work and there is no reason that the members of the tribe who are willing to live as the white man lives should not be permitted to acquire land and farm as well as raise sheep.

Founding of the Mission.
The founding of the mission grew out of a story told at a dinner which was attended by a number of church men in this city. Mr. Johnston, then secretary of the Y. M. C. A. in Flagstaff, Ariz., told of the trial of Big Wo, a Navajo chief. He was accused of the murder of a cowboy. There was no one to defend the Indian until Mr. Johnston entered the courtroom.

The mission has departments for the education of the boys of the tribe in manual training and for the girls in cooking and sewing. A chapel is also part of the present mission buildings. The mission found many strange customs and religious practices among these Indians. Those in charge of it have made plans to the various missionary organizations that are sending to foreign fields to supply them with missionaries to work among this people, many of whom had not heard of the Christian religion until the mission was established among them.

BIG DECLINE IN COFFEE.

NEW HOSPITAL IS FAVORED

Topeka, Kan., Feb. 23.—The senate ways and means committee will report to the senate that \$50,000 be appropriated for a new hospital in connection with the state university. The sum of \$50,000, still unpassed, was appropriated two years ago for the Rosevale school for a hospital. This will make a total appropriation of \$100,000 for a new hospital, just what was called for. The place of locating the hospital will be left with the regents. It is stated that the house ways and means committee is against making an appropriation for a new hospital at this time.
